ACUPUNCTURE POINTS OF BACK

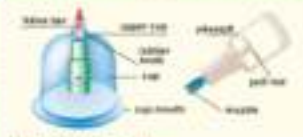
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 - 1. Acupuncture
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Overview

Chinese cupping therapy is a traditional Chinese medicine therapy that uses suction cups to create negative pressure on the skin. This negative pressure is believed to draw out toxins and improve blood circulation. The therapy is used for various conditions, including muscle pain, joint stiffness, and general weakness. It is often used in conjunction with other traditional Chinese medicine treatments like acupuncture and moxibustion.



- 1. Method of Application**
 1. The patient should be in a relaxed state and the skin should be clean.
 2. The skin should be disinfected with alcohol before cupping.
 3. The cupping device should be applied to the skin and the vacuum pump should be used to create negative pressure.
 4. The cupping device should be kept on the skin for 10-15 minutes.
 5. The cupping device should be removed and the skin should be cleaned.
- 2. Maintenance and Repairing**
 1. The cupping device should be kept clean and dry.
 2. The cupping device should be checked regularly for any damage.
 3. The cupping device should be repaired if necessary.

- 4. Precautions**
 1. Do not cupping on the face, neck, and other sensitive areas.
 2. Do not cupping on the skin that is broken or has any lesions.
 3. Do not cupping on the skin that is too dry or too oily.
 4. Do not cupping on the skin that is too hot or too cold.
 5. Do not cupping on the skin that is too thin or too thick.
 6. Do not cupping on the skin that is too sensitive.
 7. Do not cupping on the skin that is too old.
 8. Do not cupping on the skin that is too young.
 9. Do not cupping on the skin that is too weak.
 10. Do not cupping on the skin that is too strong.

Clinic Application

- Headache (i.e. cupping therapy for head-ache)**
- Acupuncture, cupping, moxibustion, and massage are used to treat headache. The therapy is used for various types of headache, including tension headache, migraine, and sinus headache. 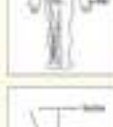
