Safety and use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your tablet. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a tablet while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their device when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your tablet and headset to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headset can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your tablet emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- Do not place your tablet on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area;
- Check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from tablet RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the tablet from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the tablet off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the tablet off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, devices can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the tablet off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the tablet is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid, or an insulin pump, etc..

Do not let children use the tablet and/or play with the tablet and accessories without supervision.

If your tablet has a removable cover, note that your tablet may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Your tablet is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organisation (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR values under the ICNIRP guidelines for this tablet model are:

During use, the actual SAR values for this tablet are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimise interference on the network, the operating power of your tablet is automatically decreased when full power is not needed. The lower the power output of the tablet, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 0 mm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the tablet should be positioned at least this distance away from the body.

If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the tablet the indicated distance away from the body.

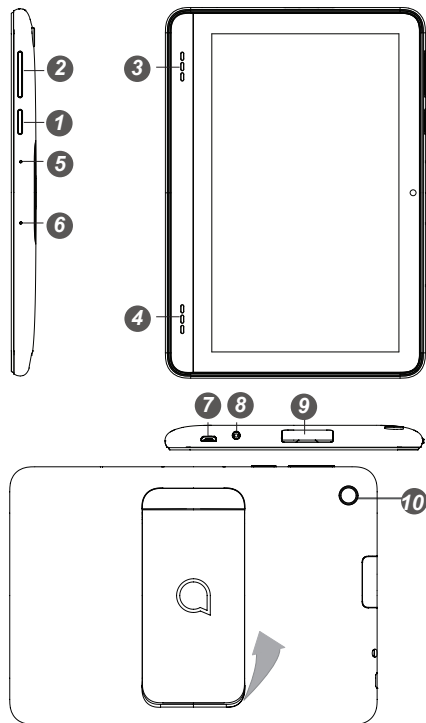

- Press and hold the **Power** key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.

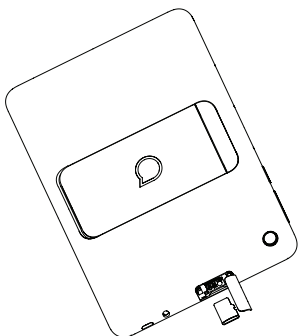

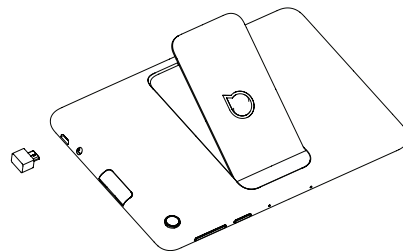
1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Setting up

Inserting or removing the microSD card.



Charging the battery



You are advised to fully charge the battery (🔋). Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen. The percentage increases as the tablet is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Powering on your tablet

Hold down the **Power** key until the tablet powers on, unlock your tablet (Swipe, PIN, Password or Pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or forget it, contact your network operator. Be sure to keep your PIN code safe.

1.2.3 Powering off your tablet

Press and hold the **Power** key until options appear, then select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the Home button to switch to the **Home** screen.



3 Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the Notification panel.

4 Google Search bar

- Touch 1 to enter text search screen
- Touch 2 to enter voice search screen

5 Favourite tray applications

- Enter the application.
- Long press to move or remove applications.

Reversible screen

The tablet supports the reversible function. From the Home screen, slide up to open the App drawer, then touch **Settings** > **Display** > **Advanced** > **Auto-rotate** screen, switch the toggle to turn on/off.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch 

To access an application, touch it with your finger.

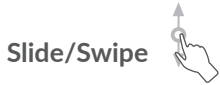
Long press 

To enter the available options for an item, long press the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, long press this contact, an option list will appear.



Drag

Long press an item and drag it to another location.



Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can slide the screen horizontally too.



Flick

Similar to swiping, flicking is a lighter and quicker stroke.



Rotate

Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the tablet sideways to have a better screen view.

1.3.2 Status bar

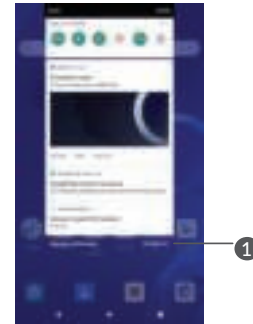
From the Status bar, you can view both tablet status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the Quick settings panel.

Drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you can touch them to access notifications.

Notification panel

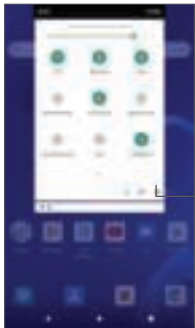
When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.



- 1 Clear all notifications (ongoing notifications will remain)

Quick Settings panel

Drag down notification panel to open the Quick Settings panel. You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.



Open **Settings**, to view the full list of settings.

1.3.3 Locking and unlocking your screen

To protect your tablet and privacy, you can lock the tablet with a pattern, PIN or password, etc.

To create a screen unlock pattern

- From the Home screen, slide up to open the App drawer, then touch **Settings > Security & location > Screen lock**.
- Draw your own pattern.

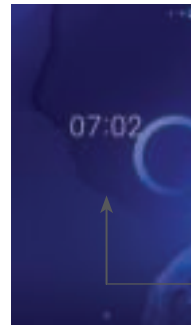
To lock tablet screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock the tablet screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, slide to draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter your PIN or password, etc.

If you have chosen **Swipe** as the screen lock, you can press the **Power** key to light up the screen, then swipe up to unlock the screen.

1.3.4 Personalising your Home screen

Reposition

Long press an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Long press an item and drag it up to the top of the Remove icon, then release.

Create folders

To improve the organisation of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Long press an empty area on the Home screen, then touch **Wallpapers** to customise wallpaper.

1.3.5 Widgets and recently used applications

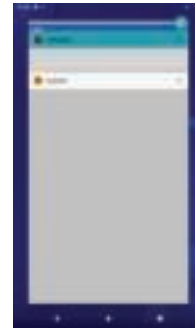
Consult widgets

Long press the empty area on the Home screen, then touch **Widgets** to display all widgets.


Touch the selected widget and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

Consult recently used applications

To consult recently used applications, touch the **Recent Apps** button. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and slide it right/left or touch X to close an application.

Touch  at the top of the screen to close all the running applications.

Using the volume key

Press the Volume key to adjust the volume.

From the Home screen, touch **Settings > Sound** to set the volume for media, alarm, notification etc.

2.1 Using the onscreen keyboard

Onscreen keyboard settings

Go to **Settings > System > Languages & input**, touch the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the tablet sideways or upright to adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation. You can adjust it by changing the settings (**Touch Settings > Display > Auto-rotate** screen).

2.1.1 Android keyboard



- 1 Enter text or numbers.
- 2 Long press to select symbols.
- 3 Switch between "abc/Abc" mode; Long press to switch to "abc/ABC" mode.
- 4 Switch to symbol and numeric keyboard.
- 5 Touch to say something.

2.2 Text editing

You can edit the texts you entered.

- Long press or double tap within the texts you want to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the selected texts.
- The following options will show: **Cut, Copy, Share.**

You can also insert new texts if preferred

- Touch where you want to type, or long press a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have cut or copied any text, touch the tab to show **Paste** which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.

3.1 How to launch Daily Board

- Charge the device to launch Daily Board.
- Touch sidebar to open daily board.



3.2 What Daily Board Shows:

1. Shows the time and the date.
2. Shows a news widget.
3. Shows the battery charge percentage and charging icon.
4. Shows The Google Assistant setup icon 'Try "Ok Google"'; if you haven't set it up yet, touch to set up The Google Assistant.

- Shows the Google Assistant button , if you ready Google Assistant setup. You can call the Google Assistant in any time if the screen is not enter sleep mode.

3.3 Daily Board settings

The dailyboard will quit if you unplug the power.

Touch to disable/enable microphone.

- Quit Daily Board

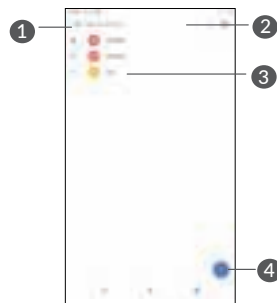
4 Contacts.....

Contacts enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your tablet and synchronise them with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your tablet.

4.3.1 Consult your Contacts

To see your contacts, touch  from the App drawer.



- 1 Display the contacts list option menu
- 2 Touch to search contacts
- 3 Long press to select contact(s) to delete
- 4 Add new contact

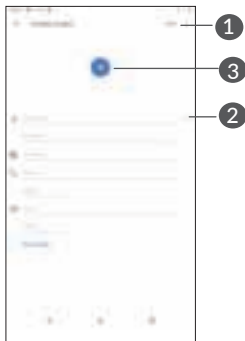


Deleted contacts will also be removed from other applications on the tablet or web the next time you synchronise your tablet.

4.3.2 Adding a contact


Touch  in the contact list to create a new contact.


You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.




- 1 When finished, touch this icon to save
- 2 Touch to open available labels
- 3 Select a picture or take a photo for the contact

Add to/Remove from Favourites ⁽¹⁾

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch  to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch the star  on the contact details screen.

4.3.3 Editing your contacts

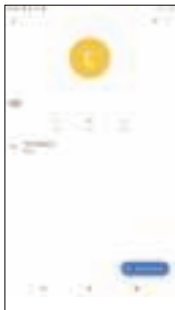
To edit contact information, touch  in the contact details screen.

When finished, touch **Save** to save.

4.3.4 Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact to open Quick contact for Android.


⁽¹⁾ Only contacts and account contacts can be added to Favourites.




The icons available on the Quick contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your tablet.

4.3.5 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts


This tablet enables you to import or export contacts between your tablet and tablet storage.


From the Contacts screen, touch  to open the options menu. Touch **Settings > Import/Export**.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch the contact you want to share, touch  and Share from the contact details screen.


4.3.6 Displaying contacts

You can configure which list of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch  and touch Contacts to display from contacts list screen, then you can choose which contacts to display.

Touch  and then **Settings > Display** options to sort the list by touching **First name** or **Last name**, as well as viewing contact names by touching **First name first** or **Last name first**.

4.3.7 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your tablet.

To add an account, touch  from the contacts list and touch **Settings > Accounts > Add account**, or from the Home screen, slide up, then **Settings > Accounts > Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account setups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the tablet. Touch the account you want to delete . Touch **REMOVE ACCOUNT**.

Auto-sync

On the **Accounts** screen, touch the **Automatically sync data** toggle. When activated, all changes to information on the tablet or online will be automatically synchronised with each other.

5 Calendar, Clock, and Calculator.....

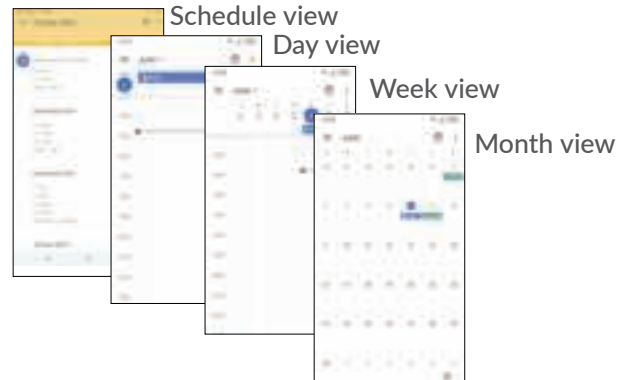
5.1 Calendar.....

You can use **Calendar** to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, slide up from the Home screen, then touch Calendar.


5.1.1 Multimode view


You can display the Calendar by Schedule, Day, Week, or Month.





5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.


- Touch .
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select All-day.
- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you want to invite. The guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, touch SAVE from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Week view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area which will then turn , then touch the icon to create the new event.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen. Touch  to edit the event, or touch  and then Delete to delete.

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon  will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Slide down left from the Status bar to open the Notification panel and touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch the **Back** button to keep the reminders pending in the Status bar and the Notification panel.

5.2 Clock.....

Your mobile tablet has a built-in clock.


To view the current time, slide up from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.


5.2.1 Clock

To view the clock, touch  on the Time screen.

Touch  to add a time zone.

5.2.2 Alarm

From the Time screen, touch  to enter the Alarm screen.


Turn on  to enable the alarm.



Touch  to add a new alarm:

Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.

Touch  and then  to delete the selected alarm.




5.2.3 Timer

From the Time screen, touch  to enter the Timer screen.


- Enter the time. The time should be typed in second, minute and hour number sequence.
- Touch  to start the countdown.
- Touch  to pause the countdown.
- Touch Delete to delete current countdown label.

5.2.4 Stopwatch

From the Time screen, touch  to enter the Stopwatch screen.

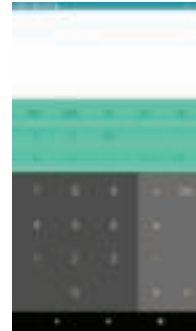
- Touch  to start the timer.
- Touch **Lap** to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- Touch  to halt the total and lap times. These will only restart after  is touched.
- Touch **Reset** to reset the record.
- Touch **Share** to share.

5.2.5 Adjust Clock settings

Touch  and then **Settings** to access **Clock** and Alarms settings.

5.3 Calculator

To use the calculator, slide up from the Home screen, then touch Calculator.



Touch **DEL** to delete digits one by one, or long press **DEL** to delete all at once.


6 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this tablet, you can use Wi-Fi.

6.1 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the internet when your tablet is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your tablet.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch **Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi**.
- Turn on .
- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch **CONNECT**.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch **Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi**.

- Touch **Add network**.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch **SAVE**.

To forget a Wi-Fi network


The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- On the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **FORGET** in the dialog that opens.

6.2 Connecting to a Bluetooth device ⁽¹⁾

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth**.
- Turn on Bluetooth .

⁽¹⁾ You are recommended to use alcatel Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your tablet. You can go to www.alcatelmobile.com for more information about the alcatel Bluetooth headset.

Your device name and other available devices will appear on screen.

To rename your device


- Touch **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth**.
- Touch device name.
- Enter a name, and touch **RENAME** to confirm.

To pair/connect your tablet with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your tablet with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth > Pair new device**.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to pair your tablet with in the list.
- In the dialog that pops up, touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your tablet will be connected to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch  beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch **FORGET** to confirm.

6.3 Connecting to a computer via USB

With a USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your tablet and a computer.

To connect your tablet to the computer

Use the USB cable that came with your tablet to connect the device to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.

Open the Notification panel and touch **Charging the device via USB**. Then from the appeared dialogue, choose the way in which you want to transfer files. By default, Charge this device is selected.

6.4 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch **Settings > Network & internet > VPN** and then touch .

- On the screen that opens, follow your network administrator's instructions to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch **SAVE**.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set screenlock, such as PIN code or password for your tablet.

To connect/disconnect to/from VPN

To connect to a VPN:


- Touch **Settings > Network & internet > VPN**.
- The **VPNs** you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **CONNECT**.

To disconnect from a VPN:

- Touch the VPN you want to disconnect from. In the dialog that opens, touch **DISCONNECT**.


To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch **Settings > Network & internet > VPN**.
- The **VPNs** you have added are listed. Touch the  icon next to the VPN you want to edit.

- After editing, touch **SAVE**.

To delete a VPN:

- Touch the  icon next to the selected **VPN**, then touch **FORGET** to delete it.

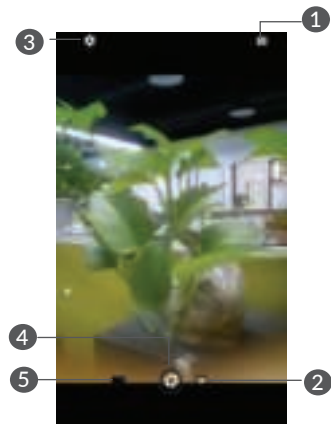
7 Multimedia applications

7.1 Camera

Your mobile tablet is fitted with a camera for taking photos and videos.

Before using the camera, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.


To take a photo or video, touch Camera from the Home screen.





1 Switch between front/back camera




- 2 Touch to take a video
- 3 Open settings
- 4 Take a photo
- 5 View the photos or videos you have taken

To take a photo



The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary and touch  to capture. The photo will be automatically saved.

To take a video

Touch  to change the camera mode to video, then touch  to start video recording.

Touch  to pause video recording and touch  to continue. Touch  to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch , then Gmail/Bluetooth/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Touch  to return to **Camera**.

7.1.1 Photo

Photo acts as a media player for you to view photos and play videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To view the photos you have taken, touch photo from the Home screen.

Select for further operation.




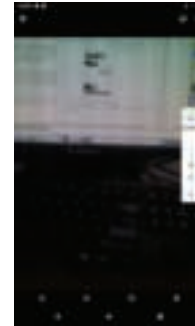
To view a picture/play a video




Pictures and videos are displayed in the Photo

Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Find the picture you want to work on, and touch the picture in the full-screen picture view. Touch < to share the picture, Touch  and select **Use as** to set the picture as Contact photo or Wallpaper.



-  Touch to delete picture.
-  Touch to get picture's information.
-  Adjust the picture colour.

8 Others

8.1 Support Centre

Support Centre helps you to learn more about Hot FAQs, operation instructions, troubleshooting, etc. You can also feedback your comments to us through it.

8.2 Other applications ⁽¹⁾

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your tablet. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, refer to the leaflet provided with the tablet. To download and install more 3rd party applications, use the Google Play Store application.

⁽¹⁾ Application availability depends on country and operator.

9 Google applications

Google apps are preinstalled on your tablet to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.

9.1 Chrome

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronised with your Google account.

9.2 Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your tablet. With this application, you can send and receive emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, etc. Emails can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account.

9.3 Maps

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for travelling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can get your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

9.4 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the internet.

9.5 Play Store

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

9.6 Drive

A file storage and synchronisation service created by Google, which allows users to store files in the cloud, share and edit files.

Files in Drive are kept secure and can be accessed from any device by logging in to your Google account. Files or folders can be shared privately with other Google account users.

9.7 Play Music

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for internet-connected devices, the Google Play Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline. Songs purchased through Play Music are automatically added to the user's account.

9.8 Duo

A video chat mobile app.

With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.

9.9 Photos

Google Photos stores and backs up your photos and videos. It also automatically analyses photos and organises them into groups, so that you can quickly find the photos you need.

10 Settings.....

To go to Settings, slide up from the Home screen, then touch Settings.


10.1 Network & internet

10.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can access the internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the Wi-Fi screen and configure an access point to connect your tablet to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, refer to "6.1 Wi-Fi".

10.1.2 Network & internet > Airplane mode

Turn on Airplane mode  to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

10.1.3 Network & internet > VPN

For more information on VPN, refer to "6.4 Connecting to virtual private networks".

10.2 Connected devices

Bluetooth allows your tablet to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, refer to "6.2 Connecting to a Bluetooth device.

10.3 Apps & notifications

Touch to view details about the applications installed on your tablet, to manage their data usage or force them to stop.

In the App Permissions menu of an application, you can grant permissions for the app, such as allowing the app to access your Camera, Contacts, Location, etc.

10.4 Battery

Touch any category in the battery management screen to view its power consumption, etc.

10.5 Display

In this menu, you can adjust your screen brightness, wallpaper, sleep time, font size, etc.

To rotate screen contents when device is rotated, touch to select Auto-rotate screen.

10.6 Sound

Touch to adjust notification ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

10.7 Storage

Touch to monitor tablet storage and available space.

10.8 Security & location

10.8.1 Device security

Screen lock

Touch to set your screen unlock method. For example, you can unlock your tablet by sliding the screen, entering a password, or drawing a pattern, etc.

Smart lock


With Smart lock, you can set your trusted devices, places, voice, etc. To enable this function you must first set a screen lock.

10.8.2 Privacy

Touch to set Encryption & credential, device admin apps, etc.

Location

-On

Turn on  to enable the use of information from Wi-Fi to determine your approximate location, for use in Google Maps, when you search, and so on.

10.9 Accounts

Touch to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronise data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronise user data automatically.

Add account

Touch **Add account** to add an account for the selected app.

10.10 Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your tablet.

10.11 Digital Wellbeing

Touch to view the screen time for the app you recent used, and manage notifications to reduce interruptions.

10.12 Google

Touch to configure your Google account and services settings.

10.13 System


10.13.1 Languages & input

Touch to configure language settings, the on-screen keyboard, voice input settings, pointer speed, etc.

10.13.2 Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customise your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

10.13.3 Backup

Turn on  to back up your tablet's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your tablet, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new tablet when you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure in the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

10.13.4 Reset options

Network settings reset

Touch to reset all network settings.

Factory data reset

Erase all of your personal data from internal tablet storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the device does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded.

If you reset the device in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your tablet, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the Volume up key and the Power key at same time until the screen lights up.

10.13.5 System updates

If you want to update the system, touch **CHECK FOR UPDATES NOW** (refer to "11.1 Upgrade").

10.13.6 Regulatory & safety

Touch to view product information.

10.13.7 About tablet

This contains information such as Legal information, Model number, Android version, Android security patch level, Baseband version, Kernel version, and **Build** number.

11 Making the most of your tablet

11.1 Updates

Use the Updates app to update your tablet software. To access Updates, go to **Settings > System > Advanced > System updates**.

Touch **CHECK FOR UPDATES** and the tablet will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, touch the **DOWNLOAD NEW VERSION** button, and when that's finished, touch **INSTALL** to complete the update. Now your tablet will have the latest version of the software. Turn on Wi-Fi before searching for updates. Settings for Automatically download are also available once you restart the tablet. If you have chosen Automatically download, when the system discovers the new version, a dialog will pop up where you can choose to download the update or ignore. A notification will also appear in the Status bar.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

13 Warranty.....

Your tablet is warranted against any defect or malfunctioning which may occur in conditions of normal use during the warranty period of twelve (12) months ⁽¹⁾ from the date of purchase as shown on your original invoice.

Batteries ⁽²⁾ and accessories sold with your tablet are also warranted against any defect which may occur during the first six (6) months ⁽¹⁾ from the date of purchase as shown on your original invoice.

In case of any defect of your tablet which prevents you from normal use thereof, you must immediately inform your vendor and present your tablet with your proof of purchase.

⁽¹⁾ The warranty period may vary depending on your country.

⁽²⁾ The life of a rechargeable tablet battery in terms of conversation time, standby time and total service life, will depend on the conditions of use and network configuration. Batteries being considered expendable supplies, the specifications state that you should obtain optimal performance for your tablet during the first six months after purchase and for approximately 200 more recharges.

If the defect is confirmed, your tablet or part thereof will be either replaced or repaired, as appropriate. Repaired tablet and accessories are entitled to a one (1) month warranty for the same defect. Repair or replacement may be carried out using reconditioned components offering equivalent functionality.

This warranty covers the cost of parts and labor but excludes any other costs.

This warranty shall not apply to defects to your tablet and/or accessory due to (without any limitation):

- Non-compliance with the instructions for use or installation, or with technical and safety standards applicable in the geographical area where your tablet is used;
- Connection to any equipment not supplied or not recommended by TCL Communication Ltd.;
- Modification or repair performed by individuals not authorised by TCL Communication Ltd. or its affiliates or your vendor;
- Modification, adjustment or alteration of software or hardware performed by individuals not authorised by TCL Communication Ltd.;
- Inclement weather, lightning, fire, humidity, infiltration of liquids or foods, chemical products, download of files, crash, high voltage, corrosion, oxidation...

Your tablet will not be repaired in cases where labels or serial numbers (IMEI) have been removed or altered.

There are no express warranties, whether written, oral or implied, other than this printed limited warranty or the mandatory warranty provided by your country or jurisdiction.

In no event shall TCL Communication Ltd. or any of its affiliates be liable for indirect, incidental or consequential damages of any nature whatsoever, including but not limited to commercial or financial loss or damage, loss of data or loss of image to the full extent those damages can be disclaimed by law.

Some countries/states do not allow the exclusion or limitation of indirect, incidental or consequential damages, or limitation of the duration of implied warranties, so the preceding limitations or exclusions may not apply to you.

14 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service centre, here are some instructions to help you troubleshoot your tablet:

- For optimal operation, fully charge the battery.
- To improve the tablet's performance, remove unnecessary files or apps on your tablet.
- Update your tablet's software via the Updates application. Or you can touch **Settings > System > System updates** to update software.
- Reset your tablet via Factory data reset. Touch **Settings > System > Reset option > Factory data reset > RESET** tablet. Another method is to hold down the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time when your tablet is powered off. All your tablet data will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully back up your tablet data before resetting.

and carry out the following checks:

My tablet can't be switched on or is frozen

- When the tablet can't be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed. Then switch it on again.

- When the tablet falls into a loop during power on animation and the user interface can't be accessed, press and hold the Power key to reset. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by third party applications.
- If neither method is effective, reset the tablet by pressing the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time till the screen light, press the Volume up key to choose the recovery mode. Press the Volume key to select Wipe data/Factory reset, and press the Power key to confirm each selection.

My tablet has not responded for several minutes

- If your tablet doesn't respond, turn off your tablet by pressing and holding the Power key until it turns off and then restart it again.
- If your tablet has a removable battery, remove the battery and reinsert it, then restart the tablet.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the tablet.

My tablet turns off by itself

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your tablet, and make sure that the Power key is not accidentally pressed while the screen is unlocked.
- Check the battery charge level.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the tablet or update software.

My tablet can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the Alcatel charger that comes with the tablet.
- If your tablet has a removable battery, make sure that your battery is inserted properly and clean the battery contact if it's dirty. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger.
- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power has been empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charging indicator on the screen.
- Make sure that charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C (32°F) to 40°C (104°F)).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

My tablet can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

I can't use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require an Alcatel accessory.

I can't download new files

- Make sure that there is sufficient tablet storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your operator.

The tablet can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your tablet is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two devices are within Bluetooth's detection range.

The battery drains too fast

- Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 150 minutes).
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used for extended periods of time.

- Turn off Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.

The tablet becomes warm following, game playing, internet surfing or running other complex applications

- This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data. Ending the above actions will make your tablet return to normal temperature.

After a factory data reset is performed, I can't use my tablet without entering Google account credentials

- After a reset is performed, you must enter the original Google account credentials that were used on this tablet.
- If you don't remember your Google account credentials, complete Google account recovery procedures.
- If you still cannot access your tablet apply to the authorised repair centre, but remember that it will not be regarded as warranty case.

I forget some passwords/codes/keys on tablet

- Perform a factory data reset.
- If you still cannot access your tablet, apply to the authorised repair centre, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.
