Power supply

Unable to turn on the speaker or charge the built-in rechargeable battery

- The speaker automatically turns off, and the (on/standby) indicator flashes in red (protect mode).

Do not hold 5 directly.



- (on/standby) button/indicator
 Press to turn the speaker on and off.
 Additionally, the indicator shows the state of charge.
- 2. 🞵 (Push & Play) button/indicator
- 3. DC IN 5 V jack
- 4. AUDIO IN jack
- 5. Organic glass tweeter

The + side has a tactile (raised) dot. Use it as a reference for operations. The tactile dot is inside the fabric of the speaker.

For our visually impaired customers:

The power button and volume buttons are located on the side of the speaker that is covered by cloth. From the right of the USB cable's port, there are 2 buttons, underneath the cloth, that adjust the volume. The button for raising the volume has a tactile dot to help you locate it. Use this as a mark for operations. To the left of the USB cable's port are the power button and connection button, underneath the cloth. The button on the outer side is the power button.

Charging the speaker

The speaker can be used with either the USB AC adaptor (supplied) or the built-in lithium ion rechargeable battery. Charge the built-in rechargeable battery for at least 1 hour by connecting the USB AC adaptor before using the speaker for the first time.

You can operate the speaker using the built-in rechargeable battery instead of the USB AC adaptor by charging the speaker before use.

Plug the micro-USB cable (supplied) into the USB AC adaptor (supplied).

- 2 Plug the micro-USB cable into the DC IN 5 V jack.
- 3 Plug the USB AC adaptor's plug securely into an AC outlet.



When you start to charge the speaker for the first time after purchase, the speaker automatically turns on and the (on/standby) indicator slowly flashes in white. When charging is complete, the () (on/standby) indicator lights up white.

If you start to charge the speaker while it is off, the () (on/standby) indicator lights up orange. The indicator turns off when charging is complete. It takes about 5 hours^{*} to charge the speaker.

* Time that is required to charge the empty built-in rechargeable battery to its full capacity.

If an AC power cord or conversion adaptor is supplied

The shape of the plug on the USB AC adaptor and the connection method differ. According your country or region, connect the AC power cord and conversion adaptor to the USB AC adaptor.

Built-in rechargeable battery life (when using the BLUETOOTH connection)

About 8 hours

* The time may differ from the time written here, depending how the speaker is used, such as the volume, music playback, and ambient temperature.

When the built-in rechargeable battery is running low

The 🕐 (on/standby) indicator slowly flashes in red and an alert sounds to let you know that the built-in rechargeable battery is running low. Please charge the speaker. Turn off the speaker when you charge it to charge more quickly.

Hint

If the () (on/standby) indicator is not lit when the speaker is connected to an AC outlet while the speaker is off, the built-in rechargeable battery is fully charged. Once the built-in rechargeable battery is fully charged, it will not be charged further, even if the speaker is kept connected to an AC outlet. (When the Network Standby function is off)

Note

- Even if you do not intend to use the speaker for a long time, charge the built-in rechargeable battery to its full capacity once every six months to maintain its performance.
- When charging the built-in rechargeable battery, use the supplied USB AC adaptor and micro-USB cable. Using anything other than the supplied USB AC adaptor or micro-USB cable may result in an inability to charge or cause malfunctions.
- Depending on the specifications of the Windows operating system, the built-in rechargeable battery may not be able to charge, even if the speaker is connected to the USB port of a computer on which Windows 8/8.1 or Windows 10 is installed.

Turning the power on/off

Press the () (on/standby) button.

The speaker turns on. Pressing the 🖞 (on/standby) button again turns off the speaker. When the speaker turns on, the 🖞 (on/standby) indicator slowly flashes in white.



Note

The do (on/standby) indicator flashing slowly in red indicates that the built-in rechargeable battery is running low. Please charge the speaker. Turn off the speaker when you charge it to charge more quickly.

Using the BLUETOOTH[®]/Network Standby function

If you turn on the BLUETOOTH/Network Standby function, even when the speaker is off, you can turn on the speaker from a BLUETOOTH device or a device on your home network. This is useful because the speaker can start up more quickly than usual.

The BLUETOOTH/Network Standby function can be set only when the speaker is connected to an AC outlet via the USB AC adaptor (supplied).

When the speaker is being powered by the built-in rechargeable battery only, the BLUETOOTH/Network Standby function is not available.



Turn on the speaker while it is plugged into an AC outlet.

Use Sony | Music Center to connect the speaker to a Wi-Fi network.

Operate the speaker by following the on-screen instructions in Sony | Music Center.

You can also turn off the BLUETOOTH/Network Standby function from Sony | Music Center. Operate the speaker by following the on-screen instructions in Sony | Music Center.

Hint

- If you are connecting the speaker to Wi-Fi for the first time after purchase, the BLUETOOTH/Network Standby function automatically turns on.

Auto Standby function

When about 15 minutes have passed under the following conditions, the speaker automatically turns off. This is not a malfunction. The Auto Standby function is set to on at the time of purchase. You can switch the Auto Standby function on and off from the settings menu in Sony | Music Center.

- The speaker is not being operated.
- No music (sound) is played when the speaker is connected to a BLUETOOTH device.
- The music (sound) of an audio device connected to the AUDIO IN jack is not playing back, or the music (sound) output from an audio device is remarkably weak.

Pairing and connecting with BLUETOOTH[®] devices

When pairing with two or more BLUETOOTH devices, perform the following pairing procedure for each device. Before operating the speaker, be sure to do the following:

- Place the BLUETOOTH device within 1 m (3.2 ft) of the speaker.
- Connect the speaker to an AC outlet via the supplied USB AC adaptor. Or, charge the built-in rechargeable battery sufficiently.
- Stop playback on a BLUETOOTH device.
- Turn down the volume of the BLUETOOTH device and speaker to avoid any sudden loud sound output from the speaker. Depending on the BLUETOOTH device, the volume of the device may be synchronized with the speaker.



Press 也 (on/standby) button.

The speaker turns on. The BLUETOOTH indicator slowly flashes in white.



When you turn on the speaker, the speaker tries to make a BLUETOOTH connection with the last connected BLUETOOTH device. If there is a BLUETOOTH device to which the speaker was previously connected nearby, simply turning on the speaker may cause the speaker to connect to that device automatically and cause the BLUETOOTH indicator to light up white. In this case, turn off the BLUETOOTH function or turn off the power of the currently connected BLUETOOTH device.

Press and hold the BLUETOOTH/ PAIRING button for about 2 seconds.

The speaker's BLUETOOTH indicator quickly flashes in white, and then the speaker makes a sound^{*}to indicate that it has entered pairing mode.

Perform the pairing procedure on the BLUETOOTH device to detect the speaker.

When a list of detected devices appears on the display of the BLUETOOTH device, select "LSPX-S2." If a passkey^{*} is required on the display of the BLUETOOTH device, enter "0000."

The passkey may also be called a "passcode," "PIN code," "PIN number" or "password."

Listen for the sound^{*} that indicates pairing was successful.

The BLUETOOTH indicator also lights up white.
If the BLUETOOTH connection is not established, repeat from step
.

Hint

- Once the BLUETOOTH function is activated on the BLUETOOTH device which has been connected to the speaker via a BLUETOOTH connection, the BLUETOOTH device is connected to the speaker again by just pressing the the (on/standby) button.
- For details on operating a BLUETOOTH device, refer to the operating instructions supplied with the BLUETOOTH device.

Note

- After about 5 minutes, the speaker's pairing mode is canceled and the BLUETOOTH indicator turns off. If the speaker's pairing mode is canceled before the procedure is complete, do the operations from step
 again.
- The passkey of this speaker is "0000." If a passkey besides "0000" is set on the BLUETOOTH device, pairing cannot be done with the speaker.
- Once the BLUETOOTH devices are paired, there is no need to pair them again, except in the following cases:
 - Pairing information has been deleted after repair, etc.
 - The speaker is already paired with 8 devices and another device is to be paired.
 The speaker can be paired with up to 8 devices. If a new device is paired after 8 devices have already been paired, the device that was paired earliest is replaced by the new one.
 - The pairing information of the speaker has been deleted from the BLUETOOTH device.
 - The speaker is initialized.

All pairing information will be deleted. If you initialize the speaker, it may not be able to connect your iPhone/iPod touch or computer. In this case, erase the pairing information of the speaker on your iPhone/iPod touch or computer, and then perform the pairing procedure again.

- The speaker can be paired with multiple devices, but can only play music from one paired device at a time.
- To output music from a BLUETOOTH device with the connection cord still in the AUDIO IN jack, either press the BLUETOOTH/
 PAIRING button on the bottom of the speaker or use Sony | Music Center to switch to the music that you want to use for play back.

Connecting with an NFC-compatible device by One-touch (NFC)

By touching the speaker with an NFC-compatible device such as a smartphone, the speaker turns on automatically, and then proceeds to pairing and BLUETOOTH connection.

Compatible smartphones

NFC-compatible smartphones with Android[™] 4.1 or later installed

Compatible WALKMAN[®] models

NFC-compatible WALKMAN[®] models

Even if your WALKMAN[®] is compatible with the NFC function, it may not be able to make a BLUETOOTH connection with the speaker by Onetouch. For details on the compatible models, refer to the operating instructions supplied with the WALKMAN[®].

NFC

NFC (Near Field Communication) is a technology enabling short-range wireless communication between various devices, such as smartphones and IC tags.

Thanks to the NFC function, data communication - for example, BLUETOOTH pairing - can be achieved easily by simply touching NFC-compatible devices together (i.e., at the N-mark symbol or location designated on each device).

Do the following before starting.

- Stop playback on the device.
- Turn down the volume of the device and speaker to avoid sudden loud sound output from the speaker. Depending on the device, the volume of the device will be synchronized with the speaker.
- Cancel the screen lock on the device.

1 Set the NFC function of the device to on.

Touch and hold the N-marked part of the speaker with the N-marked part of the device.



Follow the on-screen instructions to connect the device, and then listen for the sound^{*} that indicates pairing was successful.

* Sound example
(Playback may require the latest browser.)
The BLUETOOTH indicator also lights up white.

Hint

- To disconnect the BLUETOOTH connection, touch the N-marked part of the speaker with the N-marked part of the device again.
- If you cannot connect the speaker, try the following.
 - Move the device over the N-mark part of the speaker slowly.
 - If the device is in a case, remove the case.
- If you touch a device on the speaker, the device terminates the BLUETOOTH connection with the current device (NFC compatible headset, etc.), and connects with the speaker.

Note

- To output music from a BLUETOOTH device with the connection cord still in the AUDIO IN jack, either press the BLUETOOTH/
 PAIRING button on the bottom of the speaker or use Sony | Music Center to switch to the music that you want to use for play back.
- If your device is a type that goes into standby mode in response to magnetic force, it may not be able to be connected by NFC.
- When using the Speaker Add function, pair with the speaker that was set as the master unit. The satellite unit cannot be paired with.

Connecting to a computer via a BLUETOOTH connection (Windows)

The operation in which you register a device with which you want to make a BLUETOOTH connection is called "pairing." If you are using a device in combination with the speaker for the first time, first pair the devices. Perform the same procedures to pair other devices.

Supported operation systems

Windows 10, Windows 8.1, Windows 7 SP1 Check the following before starting any operations:

- Your computer is within 1 m (3.2 ft) of the speaker.
- You have turned down the volume of the speaker and of the computer to which the speaker is connected to avoid any sudden loud sounds being output from the speaker.

Prepare to search for the speaker on the PC.

For Windows 10

Select [[] (Action Center)] – [Connect] in the taskbar on the bottom-right of the screen.



For Windows 8.1

Right-click on [Start], and then click [Control Panel].

When [All Control Panel Items] is displayed, select [Device and printer].

If the [Control Panel] screen is displayed instead of [All Control Panel Items], select [Large icons] or [Small icons] from [View by] on the upper right of the screen.

For Windows 7

Click the [Start] button and then [Devices and Printers].

The [🔞] mark will appear in the bottom left of the [LSPX-S2] icon during installation. When [🔞] disappears, the driver installation has finished. Proceed to step 🛐 .



Depending on a PC, this installation may take time. If driver installation takes too much time, the auto power off (Auto Standby) function of the speaker will cause it to turn off automatically. If this happens, turn on the speaker again.

6 Register the speaker to the computer.

For Windows 10

After pairing, the BLUETOOTH connection is established automatically and [Connected music] appears on the screen. Proceed to step 👩 .

For Windows 8.1

1. Right-click on [LSPX-S2] in [Devices] and select [Sound settings] from the menu that appears.



- 2. Confirm [LSPX-S2 Stereo] on the [Sound] screen.



- If there is no checkmark (green) by [LSPX-S2 Stereo], proceed to the next step (step 3).
- If [LSPX-S2 Stereo] does not appear, right-click on the [Sound] screen, and then select [Show Disabled Devices] on the menu that appears. Then proceed to the next step (step 3).



3. Right-click on [LSPX-S2 Stereo], and select [Connect] from the menu that appears.



When the speaker is connected, a checkmark will appear by [LSPX-S2 Stereo] on the [Sound] screen. Proceed to step 👩 .



If you cannot click [Connect] for [LSPX-S2 Stereo], select [Disable] for the [Default Device] that currently has a checkmark (green).



For Windows 7

1. Double-click on [LSPX-S2] in [Devices].



2. Click [Listen to Music].



When the speaker is connected, a checkmark will appear.

The procedure explained above is for guidance only. For details, refer to the operating instructions for the computer you are using.

Note

- The passkey of the speaker is "0000." If a passkey besides "0000" is set on the BLUETOOTH device, pairing cannot be done with the speaker.
- Once BLUETOOTH devices are paired, there is no need to pair them again, except in the following cases:
 - Pairing information has been deleted after repair, etc.
 - The speaker is already paired with 8 devices and another device is to be paired.
 The speaker can be paired with up to 8 devices. If a new device is paired after 8 devices have already been paired, the device that was paired earliest is replaced by the new one.
 - The pairing information with the speaker has been deleted from the BLUETOOTH device.
 - The speaker has been initialized.
 - All pairing information will be deleted. If the speaker is initialized, you may not be able to connect it to your computer or to BLUETOOTH wireless technology. If this happens, delete the speaker's pairing information from your computer, and then pair them again.
- The speaker can be paired with multiple devices, but it can only play music from one paired device at a time.
- To output music from a BLUETOOTH device with the connection cord still plugged into the AUDIO IN jack, either press the BLUETOOTH/
 PAIRING button on the bottom of the speaker or use Sony | Music Center to switch the BLUETOOTH device to the one you want to use for playback.

DLNA (Digital Living Network Alliance)

You can listen to music stored on a DLNA server (such as a PC) on a home network using the speaker. By connecting DLNA-compatible digital devices with each other on the network, you can play back music stored on a DLNA server by using a DLNA controller.

To use the PC as a DLNA server or controller, you must set up the PC.

To listen to music on a DLNA server (PC, etc.) by operating a smartphone/iPhone, etc.

Download Sony | Music Center to your smartphone/iPhone, etc.

The speaker's Wi-Fi connection, as well as the selection/playing of music on a DLNA server (such as a computer), can be done using Sony | Music Center.

To listen to music on a DLNA server using your PC as a controller

Note

- The speaker can play back music saved in the following audio formats: MP3, linear PCM, WMA, AAC, WAV, FLAC, ALAC, and AIFF. The speaker can only play back AAC files with the extensions .m4a, .mp4, and .3gp. Even if the bit rate and file format are supported, the playback of all files is not guaranteed.
- Files with DRM (Digital Rights Management) copyright protection cannot be played on the speaker. To check if a WMA file is protected by DRM, right-click the file on the PC. If there is a [License] tab, the file is DRM-copyrighted.
- When you listen to music via a home network, it may take some time to start, since each DLNA-compatible device has to recognize the component currently used.
- Some content may not be playable with DLNA CERTIFIED products.

Using a computer to connect the speaker to Wi-Fi

If you are connecting your speaker to Wi-Fi using this method, you must initialize the speaker. Be aware that initializing the speaker returns all of the settings to their defaults and deletes all of the BLUETOOTH pairing information. To connect using the BLUETOOTH wireless technology again, first delete the speaker's pairing information on your PC, and then pair with the speaker again.

This section explains how to use your computer to connect your speaker to Wi-Fi.

Check the following before starting any operations:

- The speaker is as close to a Wi-Fi router as possible.
- Both an SSID (wireless network's name) and an encryption key (WEP or WPA) are required to do Wi-Fi settings. An
 encryption key (or a network key) is a cipher for restricting the devices that can communicate with each other. These
 are used to carry out more secure communication between devices that are connected to Wi-Fi routers or access
 points.

Write down the SSID and password (encryption key) for the Wi-Fi router you are using.

For details, refer to the operating instructions for the Wi-Fi router you are using.

While the speaker is on, press and hold both the speaker's — (volume) button and ტ (on/standby) button at the same time for at least 4 seconds.



If the operation is successful, the 🕐 (on/standby) indicator flashes in white and initialization begins. Initialization requires tens of seconds.

After that, when initialization is complete, the 🕐 (on/standby) indicator turns off and the speaker restarts. Initializing the settings deletes all BLUETOOTH pairing information and network settings.

Using 2 speakers to enjoy wireless playback via BLUETOOTH connection (Speaker Add function)

By using the Speaker Add function, you can connect a single BLUETOOTH device to 2 LSPX-S2 speakers for playback. When using the Speaker Add function, one speaker acts as the "master unit," while the other acts as the "satellite unit." Select from the following 2 playback methods.



- 1. Master unit
- 2. Satellite unit

Double mode

Both speakers play the same sound. The speaker is set to double mode by default.

Stereo mode

One speaker plays the sound on the right channel (right side), while the other speaker plays the sound on the left channel (left side) for stereo playback between the 2 speakers.

1 Turn on 2 speakers and bring them within 1 m (3.2 ft) of each other. Then press and hold the ADD (Speaker Add function) button for at least 2 seconds on each.

The speaker on which you first pressed the ADD (Speaker Add function) button is the master.

A sound^{*} will indicate that the Speaker Add function has been activated, and the BLUETOOTH indicator will flash quickly in orange.

* Sound example 式 (Playback may require the latest browser.)



Operate the speaker (master) with the flashing BLUETOOTH indicator to connect to the BLUETOOTH device.

When the BLUETOOTH indicator lights up, the BLUETOOTH device is connected to the speaker.

Start playing music on the BLUETOOTH device and adjust the volume.

Press the +/- (volume) buttons on one of the speakers to adjust the volume.

Hint

- Connect your BLUETOOTH device to the master unit.
- When using the Speaker Add function, some operations can only be performed by the master unit, while others can be performed by both the master unit and the satellite unit.
 - Functions that you can control only with the master unit:
 - pairing with BLUETOOTH devices
 - setting the Sleep Timer
 - Functions that you can control with both the master unit and the satellite unit:
 - adjusting the volume
 - switching between stereo mode and double mode
 - adjusting the brightness
 - canceling the Speaker Add function
 - turning candle light mode on and off
 - choosing the intensity of the candle light mode
- Once setup is complete, the speakers can be separated by more than 1 m (3.2 ft).
- If you turn off the power while the Speaker Add function is in use, when you turn the power back on, the speaker will attempt playback using the Speaker Add function. To use the Speaker Add function, turn on the other speaker.
- If you want to use the speaker that was last used with the Speaker Add function by itself, turn on the speaker, then press the ADD (Speaker Add function) button for at least 2 seconds to cancel the Speaker Add function.
- If any other BLUETOOTH device(s), such as a BLUETOOTH mouse or BLUETOOTH keyboard, is connected to the BLUETOOTH device that is connecting with the speaker, there may be distorted sound or noise in the speaker output. In this case, terminate the BLUETOOTH connection between the BLUETOOTH device and other BLUETOOTH device(s).
- When using the Speaker Add function, the LDAC codec cannot be used. These codecs will automatically be converted to AAC or SBC.

Note

- If you want to reset one of the speakers while using the Speaker Add function, be sure to cancel the Speaker Add function. If you
 do not cancel the Speaker Add function before resetting a speaker, malfunctions will occur, such as weak BLUETOOTH
 connections and interrupted sounds.
- You cannot listen to music from an external device connected to the AUDIO IN jack while using the Speaker Add function.
- If you are using the Speaker Add function to watch videos, there may be a lag between the video and audio.

Switching between double mode and stereo mode (Speaker Add function)

If you use 2 LSPX-S2 speakers, you can switch between playing back the same sound on both speakers (double mode) and playing back in stereo (stereo mode) by outputting sound from one speaker on the left channel, and from the other speaker on the right channel.

Press the ADD (Speaker Add function) button on one of the speakers while using the Speaker Add function.

When you press the ADD (Speaker Add function) button on one of the speakers one time, the left (L) channel and right (R) channel switch. When you press the ADD button one additional time, the mode switches to double mode. In stereo mode, the other speaker automatically switches to the sound of the opposite channel. In stereo mode, the BLUETOOTH indicator for the left (L) channel is orange, and for the right (R) channel is red. In double mode, both BLUETOOTH indicators are orange.

Preparing for the Wireless Stereo function

- Confirm that pre-installed software of the speakers is the latest version.
 For details how to check the software version, see "Detecting the latest software while connected to a network."
- You can enjoy the Wireless Stereo function only on a network connection via Wi-Fi. This function is not available with a BLUETOOTH connection. To use the BLUETOOTH connection, use the Speaker Add function.
 For details on using the Speaker Add function, refer to "Using 2 speakers to enjoy wireless playback via BLUETOOTH connection (Speaker Add function)."

Using 2 LSPX-S2 speakers (hereafter "speaker") to enjoy stereo sound (Wireless Stereo function)

Place the 2 speakers within 1 m (3.2 ft) of each other, and then turn on both of the speakers.

The 🕛 (on/standby) indicator lights up white.

Use Sony | Music Center to connect both speakers to a Wi-Fi network.

Use Sony | Music Center to do the settings for the Wireless Stereo function.

Do the settings for 1 of the 2 speakers that are connected to the Wi-Fi network. Operate the speaker by following the on-screen instructions in Sony | Music Center. The network indicator flashes in orange.

To cancel the Wireless Stereo function or use other functions

While using the Wireless Stereo function, other functions (such as the Wireless Multi-room function, Speaker Add function, and BLUETOOTH connections) are not available.

Press the BLUETOOTH/ — PAIRING button on either of the speakers.

The network indicator goes back to being lit up white, and the Wireless Stereo function is canceled. The group is also canceled.

Hint

- When connecting both speakers to the AC outlet using the USB AC adaptors, both speakers can be turned off by operating one of the speakers (Power Interlock).
- If the signal strength is weak due reasons, such as the speakers being far away from each other, the connection may be canceled temporarily. Place the speakers in a position that provides enough signal strength.
- When the connection is canceled temporarily, the speakers automatically reconnect. If it takes 10 minutes or more to reconnect after canceling, the Wireless Stereo function is canceled. When using the Wireless Stereo function the next time, start from step
 again.

Note

- Viewing videos using the Wireless Stereo function is not recommended. A slight deviation occurs between video and audio.
- When using the Wireless Stereo function, the automatic software update feature of the speakers is not activated. To update the software, cancel the Wireless Stereo function, and then connect the speaker to the wireless network.
- If a speaker detects that a software update is available while the Wireless Stereo function is in use, there may be a notification (the d) (on/standby) indicator flashes in orange 2 times) immediately after 1 of the speakers is turned on. If this happens, temporarily cancel the Wireless Stereo function. After updating both speakers to the latest software, redo the settings for the Wireless Stereo function.

Connecting to Wi-Fi to listen to music on your computer (Windows Media Player)

You can use a PC as a controller (operating device).

Music can be played back by using the "Cast to Device" function, after starting "Windows Media Player." Follow the PC's on-screen instructions in order to operate.

On safety

On turning the wireless function on/off

The wireless function of this unit turns on when you turn on the unit by pressing the 🖞 (on/standby) button. To turn off the wireless function, turn off the unit by pressing the 👌 (on/standby) button. If you are using the Network Standby function, turn off the Network Standby setting by using Sony | Music Center before turning off this unit.

On temperature rise

If the unit is used for an extended period of time, the temperature of the unit and the USB AC adaptor will rise. This is not a malfunction.

On placement

- The speaker unit, built-in amp, and cabinet are precisely tuned. Do not dismantle, modify, etc.
- Do not insert foreign objects from the opening of the speaker unit.
- Do not splash water onto this product. The product is not waterproof.
- Do not leave the unit in a place subject to high temperatures, such as direct sunlight, near a heat source or under lighting equipment.
- Do not use or leave the unit in a car.
- Do not set the unit in an inclined position. Otherwise, the unit's vibrations may cause it to fall, leading to a malfunction, damage, or reduced performance.
- Use caution when placing the unit on a specially treated (waxed, oiled, polished, etc.) surface, as staining or discoloration may result.
- Depending on the placement situation, the unit may fall or drop. Do not leave any valuable objects near the unit.
- When carrying the unit, be careful of the following.
 - Do not leave any objects susceptible to magnetism (cash cards, etc.) near the unit.
 - Do not grip the organic glass cylinder.
- Do not hit the unit against objects.

 If the unit becomes dirty, wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with mild detergent. Do not use benzine, alcohol, thinner, detergent, etc., because they will damage the surface finish. For information on cleaning the organic glass cylinder, see "On handling the organic glass cylinder."

On organic glass

The unit uses organic glass.

Misusing the organic glass may cause the glass to break, cause injury, or sometimes lead to blindness. It may also have adverse effects on the sound quality, illumination, etc. To avoid an accident, be sure to adhere to the following.

- Do not grasp the organic glass directly with your hands or lift it.
 Grasping the organic glass to lift the unit may damage the unit or cause injuries if the unit falls.
- Do not subject the unit to strong impacts, such as dropping it from a high place, hitting it against something, or stepping on it. If you hit the unit against a hard object, even without strong force, the organic glass may break, crack, chip, or warp, causing failure or low performance.
- Do not scratch the organic glass.

Small cracks and chips can cause the organic glass to break. If the glass cracks but does not immediately break, it may break suddenly at an unexpected time. Small chips, small cracks and large cracks can have a strong negative impact on sound quality, illumination, and other functions.

Do not subject the unit to extreme temperature changes.
 The organic glass is not heat resistant. Do not place the unit near or on top of hot objects.
 Extreme temperature changes may cause the glass to break or warp.

If you notice any cracks, chips, breaks, or other abnormalities in the organic glass cylinder, contact your nearest Sony dealer.

On handling the organic glass cylinder

- Without using strong force, brush away dust with a soft brush or feather duster, and use the supplied cleaning cloth to wipe the organic glass clean. (Do not use a scrubbing brush, sponge, etc.)
- If the organic glass is oily or covered in fingerprints, breathe onto it and use the supplied cleaning cloth to wipe it off.
- If the organic glass is exceptionally dirty, wipe it with the supplied cleaning cloth that has been dampened with cold or lukewarm soapy water.
- Do not use benzine, alcohol, thinner, detergent, etc., because they will damage the surface finish.
- Do not dismantle the unit, because it may cause performance and sound quality deterioration.

On the organic glass cylinder illumination

Do not look directly into the illumination.

Notes on the USB AC adaptor

- When connecting or disconnecting the USB AC adaptor, turn off the unit beforehand. Otherwise, it may cause malfunction.
- Use only the supplied USB AC adaptor and micro-USB cable. To avoid damaging the unit, do not use any other USB AC adaptor.
 Polarity of the plug



- Plug the USB AC adaptor into a nearby AC outlet. In the case of a problem, unplug it from the AC outlet immediately.
- Do not install the USB AC adaptor in a confined space, such as a bookcase or built-in cabinet.

Others

- Do not use or leave the unit in an extremely cold or hot environment (temperature outside the range of 5 °C 35 °C (41 °F 95 °F)). If the unit is used or left in outside the above range, the unit may automatically stop to protect internal circuitry.
- At high temperature, the charging may stop or the volume may reduce to protect the battery.
- It is recommended that you charge the battery when you find the charge indicator flashing. By charging the battery after the indicator starts flashing, you can use the battery longer.
- Even if you do not intend to use the unit for a long time, charge the battery to its full capacity once every 6 months to maintain its performance.
- If the duration that the unit can be used shortens to about half the normal time, consider the life span of the rechargeable battery.

Notes on charging

Life span of the built-in lithium ion rechargeable battery

- Even if you do not intend to use the speaker for a long time, charge the built-in rechargeable battery to its full capacity once every 6 months to maintain its performance.
- If the speaker is not used for a long time, it may take longer to charge the built-in rechargeable battery.
- The built-in rechargeable battery has a life span. As time passes and the number of times that the built-in
 rechargeable battery is used increases, the capacity of the built-in rechargeable battery slowly decreases. When the
 length of time that the built-in rechargeable battery can be used seems significantly shorter, despite having been fully
 charged, contact your nearest Sony dealer.
- The life span of the built-in rechargeable battery differs depending on the usage, environment, and storage method.

Caution

When the speaker detects a problem for the following causes while charging the built-in rechargeable battery, it will stop charging even if charging is not completed.

- Ambient temperature exceeds the range of 5 °C 35 °C (41 °F 95 °F).
- There is a problem with the built-in rechargeable battery.
- When charging to the built-in rechargeable battery continues for a long time.

Note

- Charging time varies depending on built-in rechargeable battery usage conditions.
- Charge the speaker in an ambient temperature of between 5 °C and 35 °C (41 °F and 95 °F).
- The speaker becomes warm during charging. This is not a malfunction.
- Avoid exposure to rapid temperature change, direct sunlight, moisture, sand, dust, or mechanical shock. Also, never leave the speaker in a car parked in the sun.
- The speaker can charge, even when its power is on, if its supplied USB AC adaptor is plugged into an AC outlet.
 In this case, it may take longer to charge the built-in rechargeable battery depending on the conditions of use. Therefore, it is recommended to turn off the speaker when charging.
- In an extremely cold or hot environment, charging stops for safety. If charging takes a long time, it also makes charging of the speaker stop. To resolve these issues, disconnect the micro-USB cable from the speaker and connect it again within an operating temperature between 5 °C and 35 °C (41 °F and 95 °F).

Updating the pre-installed software

When a new version of the software is released, you can update your speaker's pre-installed software by using the following methods.

By updating the software, new features will be added, enabling you to experience more convenient and stable use. Cancel the group of the Wireless Stereo function, etc. before updating.

Preparation for update

Software updates become possible when the speaker is in the following states.

- The speaker is connected to the AC outlet with the supplied USB AC adaptor. (Software updates cannot be performed when using with the built-in rechargeable battery.)
- The speaker is connected to the internet via Wi-Fi.
 - Update method 1: Updating automatically via the internet

If the speaker is connected to the internet, it can detect a software update and automatically update when you are not using the speaker. This feature requires speaker settings to be made.

Update method 2: Updating manually via the internet

If the speaker is connected to the internet, it can detect a software update. The 🕐 (on/standby) indicator flashes in orange 2 times, immediately after the speaker is turned on, to inform you. This is the default setting.

Hint

When the update is complete, the speaker automatically switches to BLUETOOTH/Network Standby mode.

Update method 1: Updating automatically via the internet

The speaker has a function that automatically updates it to the latest software version if you use the speaker while it is connected to the internet via Wi-Fi. This feature is disabled by default.

Preparation for update

Software updates become possible when the speaker is in the following states.

- The speaker is connected to the AC outlet with the supplied USB AC adaptor. (Software updates cannot be performed when using with the built-in rechargeable battery.)
- The speaker is connected to the internet via Wi-Fi.

To update software automatically

 Launch Sony | Music Center on your smartphone or similar device, and do the settings in [System] in the [Settings] menu.

The automatic software update feature ([Auto Update]) of the speaker is activated. If [Auto Update] is disabled, change the setting to enable.

The update is performed when you are not using the speaker^{*}, such as during midnight or when the speaker is in BLUETOOTH/Network Standby mode. The https://doi.org/101143444) indicator slowly flashes in orange while the speaker is updating.

* You can do the Time Zone settings from Sony | Music Center.

To deactivate the software automatic update

- Launch Sony | Music Center on your smartphone or similar device, and disable [Auto Update] in the [Settings] menu.
- However, the software may still be updated automatically for critical changes, even if you disable this function.

If the indicators light/flash as explained in the following:

- The network indicator lights up white for 1 second
- The BLUETOOTH indicator lights up white for 1 second
- The 也 (on/standby) indicator quickly flashes in orange

The software update has failed.

Turn off the speaker, then turn it on again. The update will resume. If the situation does not improved after switching the speaker off and on, consult your nearest Sony dealer.

Hint

- Do not turn off the speaker while it is updating.
- When the speaker is connected to a network via Wi-Fi, if the speaker detects a software update, the the (on/standby) indicator flashes in orange 2 times immediately after the speaker is turned on.

Regardless if the settings for [Auto Update] are enabled or disabled, if the speaker detects a software update, the ((on/standby)) indicator flashes in orange 2 times immediately after the speaker is turned on.

Note

- Updating normally takes about 3 to 10 minutes. It may take longer depending on your network environment.
- Do not operate the speaker during an update. While updating, keep the speaker connected to a network and connected to an AC outlet by using the USB AC adaptor. An update cannot be performed when the speaker is powered by the built-in rechargeable battery only.
- You must not interrupt the update.

Update method 2: Updating manually via the internet

If the speaker detects a software update when the speaker is used via Wi-Fi network, the 🕐 (on/standby) indicator flashes in orange 2 times immediately after the speaker is turned on. In this case, follow the steps below to update the software to the latest version.

When the update starts, any music being played will stop. Also, any BLUETOOTH connection is disconnected.

Preparation for update

Software updates become possible when the speaker is in the following states.

- The speaker is connected to the AC outlet with the supplied USB AC adaptor. (Software updates cannot be performed when using with the built-in rechargeable battery.)
- The speaker is connected to the internet via Wi-Fi.

Use Sony | Music Center to update the speaker.

Operate the speaker by following the on-screen instructions in Sony | Music Center. While updating, the speaker cannot be used. When the update is complete, the speaker automatically switches to BLUETOOTH/Network Standby mode.

If the indicators light/flash as explained in the following:

- The network indicator lights up white for 1 second
- The BLUETOOTH indicator lights up white for 1 second
- The 🔥 (on/standby) indicator quickly flashes in orange

The software update has failed.

Turn off the speaker, then turn it on again. The update will resume. If the situation does not improved after switching the speaker off and on, consult your nearest Sony dealer.

Note

- Updating normally takes about 3 to 10 minutes. It may take longer depending on your network environment.
- While updating, keep the speaker connected to a network and connected to an AC outlet by using the USB AC adaptor. An update cannot be performed when the speaker is powered by the built-in rechargeable battery only.

Detecting the latest software while connected to a network

The speaker has a function that automatically updates the software to its latest software version if you use the speaker while it is connected to Wi-Fi.

If the speaker detects that a software update has been released, the 🖞 (on/standby) indicator flashes in orange 2 times immediately after the speaker is turned on.

However, the time at which each speaker automatically detects the update differs to avoid any malfunctions due to everyone accessing the network server all at once. This section explains how to manually check the latest software released.

Preparation for detect

When under the following conditions, the speaker can detect the latest software updates.

- The speaker is connected to the AC outlet with the supplied USB AC adaptor. (Software updates cannot be performed when using with the built-in rechargeable battery.)
- The speaker is connected to a network. Check that the Network indicator is lit up white.
- When using the Wireless Stereo function, cancel the group.

1 Use Sony | Music Center to check for a software update for the speaker.

Operate the speaker by following the on-screen instructions in Sony | Music Center.

- Reset the speaker.
 Unlike when you initialize the speaker, pairing information is not erased.
 The Speaker Add function is canceled. The volume, functions, and other sound settings may also change.

Unable to turn on the speaker or charge the built-in rechargeable battery

- Make sure that the built-in rechargeable battery is charged.
- Make sure that the USB AC adaptor and micro-USB cable are securely connected.
- Make sure that the USB AC adaptor and micro-USB cable are securely connected to the speaker and the AC outlet.
- If the speaker does not turn on, or if the speaker has not been used for a long time, first charge the built-in rechargeable battery for at least 1 hour, and then turn on the speaker.
- When charging the built-in rechargeable battery, use the supplied USB AC adaptor and micro-USB cable. Using
 anything other than the supplied USB AC adaptor or micro-USB cable may result in an inability to charge or cause
 malfunctions.
- Depending on the specifications of the Windows operating system, the built-in rechargeable battery may not be able to charge, even if the speaker is connected to the USB port of a computer on which Windows 8/8.1 or Windows 10 is installed.

The speaker automatically turns off, and the (on/standby) indicator flashes in red (protect mode)

If the speaker's (on/standby) indicator is flashing in red, the speaker is in protect mode. Wait a while, and then press the () (on/standby) button again to turn on the power.
 If the situation does not improve, even after switching the speaker off and on, consult your nearest Sony dealer.

Unable to use the speaker's buttons

Resetting the speaker may resolve some issues.
 Use a pointed object, such as a pin, to press the RESET button on the bottom of the speaker.
 For details, refer to "How to use the RESET button."

The (on/standby) indicator flashes in red

• The built-in rechargeable battery's power is running low. Use the supplied micro-USB cable and USB AC adaptor to plug the speaker into an AC outlet, and then wait for at least 1 hour for the speaker to charge.

BLUETOOTH is connected, but there is no sound

- Make sure that the speaker is turned on. When the speaker is on, the 🕐 (on/standby) indicator is lit up in white.
- Make sure that the speaker has a BLUETOOTH connection with the BLUETOOTH device.
- Pair the speaker with the BLUETOOTH device again.
- The volume of the speaker or BLUETOOTH device may be low. Adjust the volume to a moderate level.
- If a cord is connected to the AUDIO IN jack of the speaker or to the BLUETOOTH device, unplug it.

Static, noise, or sound interruptions

- Make sure that the volume of the connected device is not too loud.
- If the connected device has an equalizer function, set it to off.
- Keep the speaker away from microwave ovens.
- Try setting the speaker somewhere by changing the distance between the speaker and the indoor Wi-Fi environment, etc.
- Bring the speaker and the BLUETOOTH device closer together. Remove any obstacles between the speaker and the BLUETOOTH device.
- A device with a built-in radio or tuner cannot be connected to the speaker via BLUETOOTH connection, since noise may occur in broadcasts. These devices cannot be used with the speaker via a BLUETOOTH connection.
- Place the speaker farther away from TVs, radios or tuners, etc. If you use the speaker near these devices, noise may
 interrupt the sounds coming from TVs, radios, or similar devices.
- This may be caused by signal interference. Try moving the speaker to a different location. If the noise disappears depending on the location, the speaker has not malfunctioned.

Unable to pair the speaker with a BLUETOOTH device

- Bring the speaker and the BLUETOOTH device to within 1 m (3.2 ft) of each other.
- Keep the speaker away from microwave ovens.
- Try setting the speaker somewhere by changing the distance between the speaker and the indoor Wi-Fi environment, etc.
- This may be caused by signal interference. Try moving the speaker to a different location.
- If the BLUETOOTH indicator is flashing slowly, the speaker is not in pairing mode. Press the BLUETOOTH/
 PAIRING button for about 2 seconds. The speaker will make a sound^{*} to indicate that pairing mode has been entered, and the BLUETOOTH indicator will flash quickly.
 - * Sound example 📫 (Playback may require the latest browser.)
- Charge the built-in rechargeable battery of the speaker sufficiently or connect the speaker to an AC outlet.
- When using the Speaker Add function, pair with the speaker that was set as the master unit. The speaker that was set as the satellite unit cannot pair with a device.

Unable to connect the speaker to a BLUETOOTH device with One-touch (NFC)

- Keep the NFC-compatible device close to the N marked part of the speaker until the device reacts. When they react, the NFC-compatible device vibrates and the speaker's BLUETOOTH indicator starts to quickly flash in white (depending on the NFC-compatible device, it may not vibrate). If they fail to connect, move the device slowly around the area.
- Check that the NFC function of the device is set to on.
- Unlock the screen of your smartphone.
- If the device is in a case, remove it.
- NFC reception sensitivity varies depending on the device. If the speaker and device repeatedly fail to connect by One-touch, connect the device to the speaker using the on-screen operations.
- Check that your device is compatible with NFC.
- When using the Speaker Add function, pair with the speaker that was set as the master unit. The speaker that was set as the satellite unit cannot pair with a device.
- Use an Android–installed smartphone to pair with a BLUETOOTH device.

Unable to connect to Wi-Fi

- Make sure that your Wi-Fi router (access point) is on.
- If you are connected to Wi-Fi network, place the speaker near the Wi-Fi router (access point), and then redo the settings.
- If you are using Sony | Music Center on a smartphone, or similar device, to do the speaker's Wi-Fi settings, connect your smartphone, or similar device, to the Wi-Fi you will be using in advance.
- Confirm whether the settings for the Wi-Fi router (access point) are correct. If the Wi-Fi router's SSID stealth mode is
 on, turn it off. For details on the Wi-Fi router's settings, refer to the Wi-Fi router's operating instructions.
- Bring the speaker closer to the Wi-Fi router. Devices that use a frequency in the 2.4 GHz band, such as microwaves, BLUETOOTH devices, and digital cordless devices, may be the reason that you cannot connect to Wi-Fi. Move the speaker away from such devices or turn them off.
- The speaker does not support IEEE 802.11ac. Connect using either the 2.4 GHz frequency range (11b, 11g, or 11n) or the 5 GHz frequency range (11a or 11n).
- If there are multiple home networks, check whether the speaker and the computer or smartphone are connected on separate networks.
- If you cannot connect them, even though you did the settings correctly, try the following.
 - Turn off the access point (Wi-Fi router), wait for a while, and then turn it back on.
 - Turn off the speaker, wait for a while, and then turn it back on.

Unable to connect to Wi-Fi (even though the correct SSID is selected)

- If the speaker cannot be connected, even when the correct SSID for the wireless LAN router is selected, make sure that the correct password (encryption key) is used.
- Because passwords (encryption keys) are case-sensitive, be sure to enter them while checking whether the letters
 are upper-case or lower-case when entering information. Likewise, you cannot do the settings correctly if you use
 double-byte characters, so always enter information using single-byte characters.
- Example of characters that are easily mistaken:
 - "I (upper-case I)" and "I (lower-case L)"
 - "0 (the number zero)" and "O (upper-case O)"
 - "d (lower-case D)" and "b (lower-case B)"
 - "9 (the number nine)" and "q (lower-case Q)"

Cannot connect to a network using the WPS button

- When using the Wireless Stereo function, cancel the group.
- First, connect a computer to the speaker and use the computer to search for the Wi-Fi router (access point scan), and then do the settings for the network.
- Update the firmware for your Wi-Fi router (access point) to its latest version.
- Press and hold the speaker's TIMER/ WPS button for about 2 seconds, and confirm that the speaker make a sound^{*}.

*Sound example 📢 (Playback may require the latest browser.)

- Check your Wi-Fi router's operating instructions to see if the way to operate the Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) button for your Wi-Fi router is different.
- Depending on your Wi-Fi router, you may have to press and hold its Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) button for a few seconds to set it up. For details, refer to the operating instructions for your Wi-Fi router.
- Bring the Wi-Fi router closer to the speaker.
- If your wireless router has a Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) button, you can connect to the Wi-Fi network by this method. For details, refer to the operating instructions supplied with your wireless router.
- If you cannot connect them, even though you did the settings correctly, try the following.
 - Turn off the access point (Wi-Fi router), wait for a while, and then turn it back on.
 - Turn off the speaker, wait for a while, and then turn it back on.

The speaker does not appear on the device selection screen in Sony | Music Center

• Check the Wi-Fi connection.

- Enable Wi-Fi settings on the smartphone or similar device.
- If you are using the Wi-Fi router's Privacy Separator function or Network Separation function, the speaker may be unable to access the Wi-Fi router. Disable these functions. For how to confirm settings and how to do the settings, refer to the Wi-Fi router's operating instructions.
- Make sure that the speaker and the smartphone, or similar device, on which Sony | Music Center is installed, is connected to the same SSID as your Wi-Fi router.

Good example

(The speaker () and smartphone () are connected to the same SSID () on your Wi-Fi router, so they are connected to the same network.)

When in this state, you can operate the speaker using Sony | Music Center from a smartphone or similar device.



Bad example

(The speaker (**D**) and smartphone (**E**) are connected to separate SSIDs on your Wi-Fi router (mobile router, etc. **()**, so they are connected to separate networks.)

In this state, you cannot operate the speaker using Sony | Music Center from a smartphone or similar device. If the speaker and smartphone, or similar device, are connected via BLUETOOTH wireless technology, you can use Sony | Music Center to check the SSID to which the speaker is connected.

If you want to operate the speaker from your smartphone while in a different room, but you find it difficult to connect your smartphone directly to the same Wi-Fi router as the speaker, set up distributed connectivity by using a network hub or a Wi-Fi access point set to infrastructure mode.

If you are living in a housing complex (such as an apartment or condominium), it may use Wi-Fi routers that already have lines distributed to each room in the housing complex, depending on your situation. Talk to your network administrator about how the network is configured in your situation.

Unable to connect to an online music distribution service

- Make sure that your Wi-Fi router (access point) is on.
- If you are connected to Wi-Fi network, place the speaker near the Wi-Fi router (access point), and then redo the settings.
- If the contract with your internet provider limits you to connecting only 1 device at a time to the internet, the speaker will not be able to connect to the internet if another device is already connected. Contact your telecommunications carrier or your internet provider.
- If you have turned off your smartphone, or similar device, waited for a while, and then turned it back on, once again start the Sony | Music Center app.
- Make sure that a compatible music app is installed on your smartphone or similar device.
- Be sure to use the latest version of your compatible music app.

Music is interrupted

• The DLNA-compatible server is overloaded. Exit all applications that are currently running.

- There is a problem with the Wi-Fi's signal. If you are using a microwave, or similar device, stop using it.
- Selecting WEP or WPA/WPA2-PSK (TKIP) for the security format in some IEEE 802.11n-compatible Wi-Fi
 routers/access points may diminish Wi-Fi communications. If this happens, change the format to WPA/WPA2-PSK
 (AES).

The encryption (security) format may vary, depending on the type of device. Refer to the operating instructions for your Wi-Fi router (access point).

The speaker does not appear on the device selection screen in the computer's music playback app

- A lot of computer software cannot select the speaker as a destination for audio output. Use software, such as Windows Media Player, that can select the destination for output.
- Check the Wi-Fi connection. Check whether the speaker is connected to a Wi-Fi router with the same SSID as the computer.
- If the speaker is not on, turn it on.
- The music playback app may not work correctly on PCs that use a firewall or commercially available firewall software.

If you are using firewall software, disable it. For details, refer to the operating instructions and help for the firewall software.

Unable to find the controller (operating device) / Controller is unable to access the speaker

• Make sure that your Wi-Fi router (access point) is on.

- If you are connected to Wi-Fi network, place the speaker near the Wi-Fi router (access point), and then redo the settings.
- Check whether the controller and the speaker are both connected to a Wi-Fi router with the same SSID.
- If the multicast control of Wi-Fi router or access point is in the middle of an operation, stop the operation. For details, refer to the operating instructions for the Wi-Fi router you are using.

Music playback starts automatically (home network)

• You may be able to use Sony | Music Center to control the speaker from another device on your home network. Turn the BLUETOOTH/Network Standby function off so that the speaker cannot be controlled.

Unable to connect a speaker or a BLUETOOTH device using the Speaker Add function

• After connecting the 2 speakers, pair your BLUETOOTH device with the speaker that was set as the master unit.

Sound is interrupted when using the Speaker Add function for playback

This may be caused by signal interference. Try moving the speaker to a different location. If the noise disappears depending on the location, the speaker has not malfunctioned.
 Using Sony | Music Center to set the BLUETOOTH Codec to SBC may also resolve the issue.

How to use the RESET button

When the speaker is not working properly, resetting it may resolve some issues.

1 Use a pointed object, such as a pin, to press the RESET button.

The speaker resets and turns off.



Turning on the speaker after a reset

Either press and hold the 🕐 (on/standby) button for more than 3 seconds, or use the supplied micro-USB cable and USB AC adaptor to plug the speaker into an AC outlet. The speaker automatically turns on after being plugged into an AC outlet for about 3 seconds. First, the 🕐 (on/standby) indicator slowly flashes in white for about 15 to 30 seconds, and then it stays lit.

Note

- Pairing information is not deleted, even if you reset the speaker.
- The volume, functions, and other sound settings may change.

Initializing the speaker

When the speaker is not working properly, initializing it may resolve some issues. The speaker will return to its factory default settings.

If you have checked all of the relevant items in "What can I do to solve a problem?" and the speaker still does not operate normally, or if setup failed, initialize the speaker to return it to its defaults.

Press and hold the — (volume) button and
(on/standby) button simultaneously for at least 4 seconds.



If the operation is successful, the ტ (on/standby) indicator flashes in white and initialization begins. Initialization requires tens of seconds.

After that, the 🖞 (on/standby) indicator lights up white and the initialization is complete.

Note

After the initialization is complete, the volume, functions, and other sound settings return to their defaults.

Additionally, since all of the BLUETOOTH pairing information and network settings are deleted, all settings must be done again.
