
Alive Humane Mouse Trap

USER'S MANUAL



For over a century, mouse traps have been designed to not only capture mice but also kill them. Some people even preter to avoid the trap altogether and go for a poison to kill the mice instead. But what if you want to get rid of mice without killing them? It makes a great gift for all animal lovers - - Humane & Smart "No Kill" Mouse Trap

Extremely Humane

This is about as humane as a mouse trap can be. It inflicts absolutely no pain on the mouse. Even the trap door is not triggered until the mouse is near the far end of the trap, so its tail won't get caught in it.

Extremely Safe

No poison or glue, safe around children and pest, suitable for used in home, No contact with the mouse or any droppings it may have left behind, so there is no chance of bites or risk of disease.





How It Works

- 1) Place the bait (The recommended bait for this trap is peanut butter) in a small compartment on oneend, with open holes facing towards the inside of the trap. This lures the mouse inside, where the small is coming from.
- 2) Open the gate on the another end , when mouse moving to the opposite end to access the bait , the mouse's weight moves to the far side of the fulcrum and triggers the trap . The gate closes;
- 3) Once you have the mouse captured you can take the entire trap outdoors and lift the food compartment to open the trap . Then the mouse will run out;
- 4) Check the trap frequently as these mice can dehydrate or suffocate to death if left in the trap for a few days.

Warm Tips:

- 1) Wild animals are unpredictable. Even with tasty, accessible balt, your house mouse may forgo the trap for a number of reasons: smell ,location ,obtaining food from another source. general wariness, etc. None of these reasons are related to the product so if your balt has gone untouched do not give up an please contact us for refund if you wouldn't like to try anymore.
- 2) Patience. You are attempting to capture a live creature that is very light, very fast and can fit through incredibly tiny spaces in order to survive. If you are truly interested in catching a live one and releasing it then you must have patience to do so and not expect to catch the mouse overnight, or even within a week or two. The goal of a
