DISCLAIMER

This helmet is certified according to standard EN1080:2013 which makes it appropriate for young children while pursuing recreational activities. A helmet can, however, never guarantee complete prevention of injuries.

CHOOSING THE RIGHT HELMET SIZE

A helmet can only protect properly if it has the right fit. Make sure this helmet is the right size according to the size of the head and there are no empty spaces or pressure points when worn.

To choose the right size, measure the circumference of the head (from forehead to the widest point at the back of your head) and select the size that corresponds to your measurement (in cm or inch).

The helmet size can be found on the label inside the helmet.

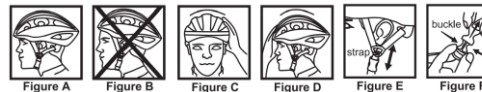
If the helmet is too tight or loose, please try another size until you have the right fit.

ADJUSTING YOUR HELMET

Check the adjustment before each use.

1. Place the helmet on the head with the front and back at the same level as in picture A whereby forehead is protected but vision not impaired. Picture B shows the incorrect way to wear the helmet.

2. In order to ensure safety and security, pull the helmet from front to back and left to right. If it slips, like in picture C & D, then adjust the wheel at the back by turning it until perfect fit.
3. Adjust the strap divider as illustrated in picture E. The straps should not cover the ears and should be firmly, but comfortably adjusted.
4. Fasten the green buckle as shown in picture F and have it attached under the chin. The buckle should not cover the chin and should be firmly, but comfortably adjusted.
5. Check the overall straps of the helmet are adjusted and fastened safely.
6. Ready to go!



CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Always take care of the helmet, even when not using it.

The comfortable padding can be cleaned with a moist cloth and a mild soapy solution as detergent. Do not use any solvents or similar products.

Keep the helmet away from any excessive high temperatures or strong UV rays. Let it dry in a ventilated and dry place.

It is recommended to replace a helmet at least every 5 years.

This helmet has been designed to absorb the impact of a shock, which may adversely impact the inner and/or outer shell and any damage may not be visible. In case of such an impactful shock, the helmet should be discarded and destroyed.

WARNINGS

This helmet is intended for use by young children while pursuing recreational activities in environments which have proven risks of head injuries in combination with risks of strangulation. Although this helmet is fitted with a self-release retention system designed to release under certain loading conditions in order to avoid possible strangulation or hanging, it is nevertheless recommended that the helmet is removed before climbing.

Do not make any alterations to the helmet shell as this may compromise your safety. Do not drill into the shell or screw on any objects.

No helmet can protect from all possible accidents. Even at slow speed, an accident can cause a serious or even fatal injury.
