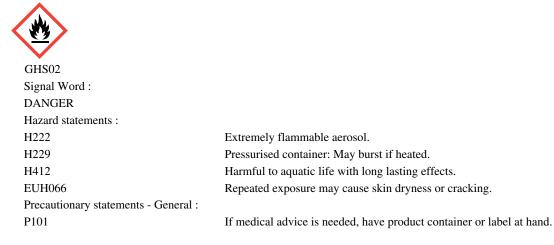

## **SECTION 4 : FIRST AID MEASURES**
