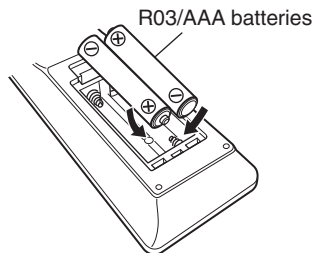
About the remote control

Inserting the batteries

- 1 Remove the rear lid in the direction of the arrow and remove it.



- 2 Insert two batteries correctly into the battery compartment as indicated.



- 3 Put the rear cover back on.

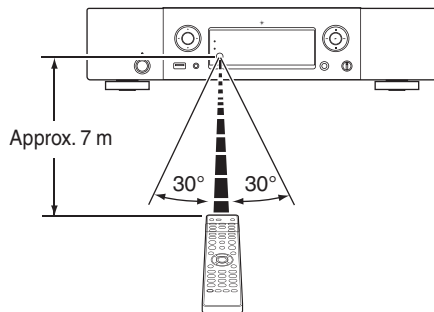
NOTE

- To prevent damage or leakage of battery fluid:
 - Do not use a new battery together with an old one.
 - Do not use two different types of batteries.
- If the battery fluid should leak, carefully wipe the fluid off the inside of the battery compartment and insert new batteries.



Operating range of the remote control unit

Point the remote control unit at the remote sensor when operating it.



Marantz Remote App

Marantz Remote App is a unique application developed for the iPad, iPhone, iPod touch and Android smartphone.

This application enables you to control Marantz network devices that are connected to your home network.

Install the App onto your iPad, iPhone, iPod touch or Android smartphone to control this device.



- Bidirectional communication is performed.
- The Marantz Remote App can be downloaded for free from the Apple App Store or Google Play store.

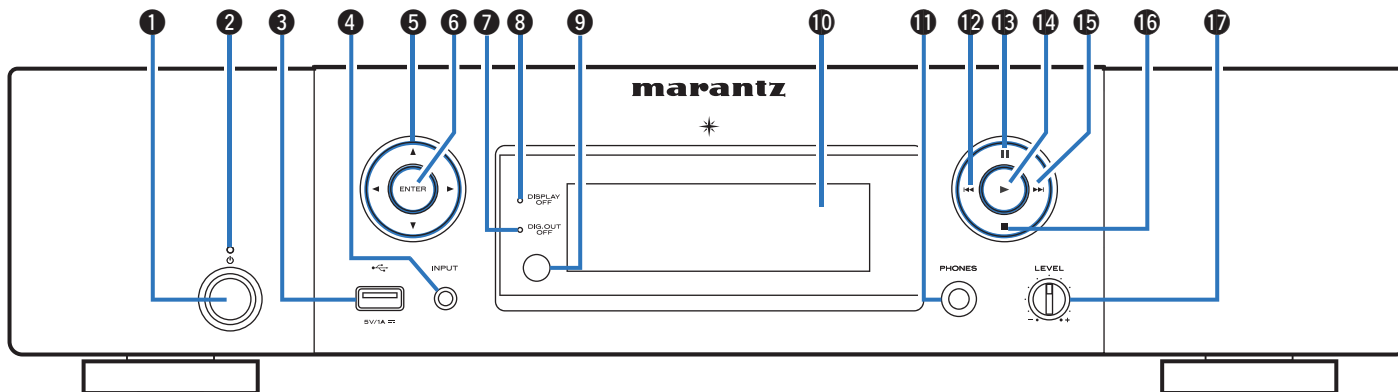

Front panel



1 POWER button (⏻)

This turns the power on/off (standby). (👉 p. 31)

2 Power indicator

The standby indicator changes as shown below according to the status of the unit.

- Power on : Off
- Normal standby : Red
- When “Network Control” is set to “On” : Orange
- iPod charge standby : Orange

3 USB port

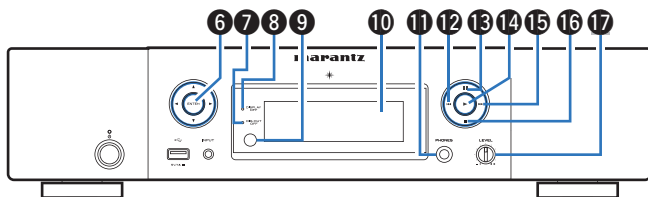
Used to connect iPod or USB memory devices. (👉 p. 22)

4 INPUT button

These select the input source. (👉 p. 32)

5 Cursor buttons (⏮⏪⏩⏭)

These select items.



6 ENTER button

This determines the selection.

7 Digital output off indicator (DIG. OUT OFF)

This indicator lights up when the digital output setting is set to off. (☞ p. 33)

8 DISPLAY OFF indicator

This indicator lights up when the display is off. (☞ p. 33)

9 Remote control sensor

This receives signals from the remote control unit.

10 Display

Various information is displayed here.

11 Headphones jack (PHONES)

Used to connect headphones.

NOTE

To prevent hearing loss, do not raise the volume level excessively when using headphones.

12 Fast-reverse/Reverse-skip button (⏮)

Returns to the start of the currently playing track. Press and hold to fast-reverse the track. (☞ p. 42, 50, 54)

13 Pause button (⏸)

Pauses playback. (☞ p. 42, 50, 54)

14 Play button (▶)

Playback starts. (☞ p. 42, 50, 54)

15 Fast-forward/Forward-skip button (⏭)

Plays the next track. Press and hold to fast-forward the track. (☞ p. 42, 50, 54)

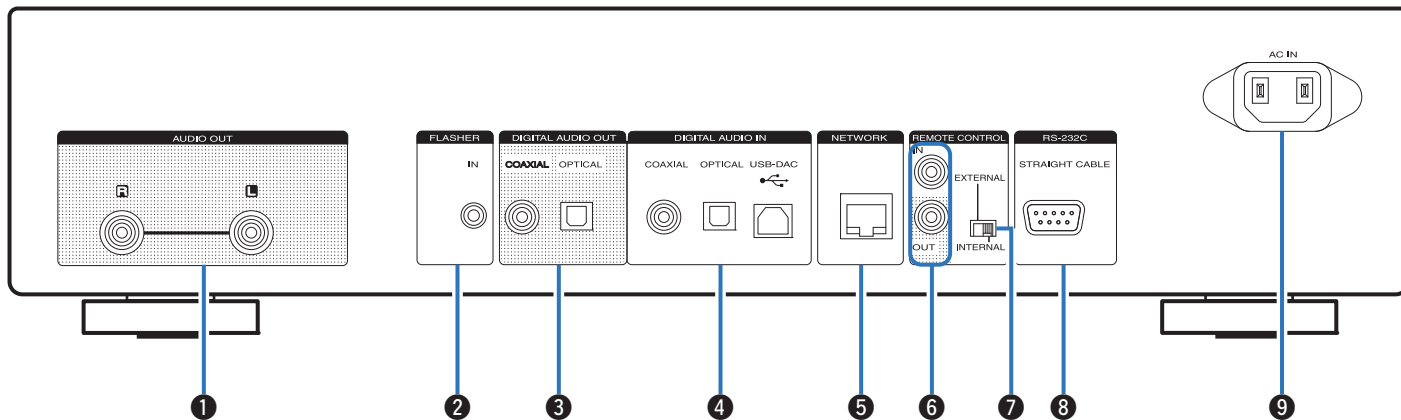
16 Stop button (■)

Stops playback. (☞ p. 42, 50, 54)

17 Headphone volume control knob (LEVEL)

Adjusts the headphone volume.

Rear panel



1 AUDIO OUT connectors

Used to connect devices equipped with analog audio inputs connectors or an external power amplifier. (☞ p. 18)

2 FLASHER IN jack

Used to connect a control box, etc. (☞ p. 27)

3 DIGITAL OUTPUT connectors

Used to connect an AV receiver or D/A converter that has a digital input connectors. (☞ p. 19)

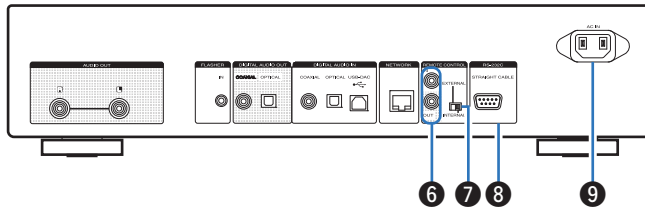
4 DIGITAL INPUT connectors

Used to connect a computer or devices equipped with digital audio output connectors. (☞ p. 20)

5 NETWORK connector

Used to connect to a LAN cable when connecting to a wired LAN network. (☞ p. 24)





**6 Remote control input/output connectors
(REMOTE CONTROL IN/OUT)**

Used to connect to a Marantz amplifier that is compatible with the remote control function. (👉 p. 28)

7 EXTERNAL/INTERNAL switch

Turn this switch to “EXTERNAL” to operate the unit by pointing the remote control at the amplifier connected to this unit using the remote control connection. (👉 p. 28)

8 RS-232C connector

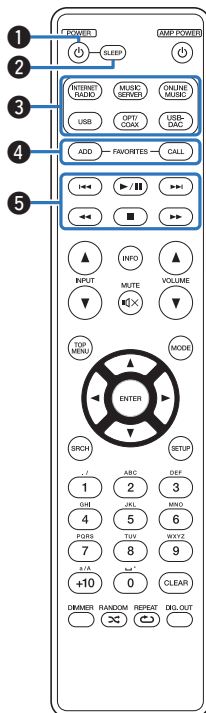
Used to connect home automation controller devices fitted with RS-232C terminals. (👉 p. 26)

9 AC inlet (AC IN)

Used to connect the power cord. (👉 p. 29)



Remote control unit



The included remote control unit can be used to operate Marantz amplifiers. When using it, also refer to the operating instructions of the other devices.

- The remote control may not operate some devices.

1 POWER button (⏻)

This turns the power on/off (standby). (☞ p. 31)

2 SLEEP button

This sets the sleep timer. (☞ p. 33)

3 Input source select buttons

These select the input source. (☞ p. 32)

4 FAVORITES ADD / CALL buttons (FAVORITES ADD / CALL)

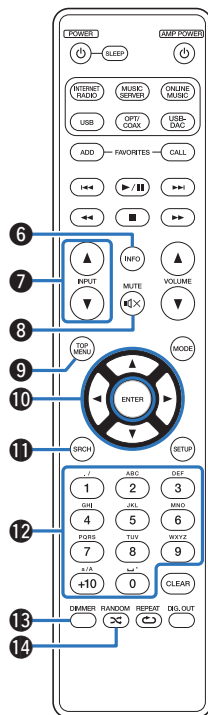
- To add radio stations or files to the favorite list, press ADD button.
- To call up a radio station or file registered in the favorite list, press CALL button. (☞ p. 45)

5 System buttons

These perform playback related operations. (☞ p. 42, 50, 54)

- Skip buttons (◀◀, ▶▶)
- Play/pause button (▶/||)
- Fast-reverse / Fast-forward buttons (◀◀, ▶▶)
- Stop button (■)





6 Information button (INFO)

This switches display items such as the album name and title name in the playback screen. (☞ p. 35, 42, 50, 54)

7 Input source select buttons (INPUT ▲▼)

This switches the input source of the amp connected to this unit. (☞ p. 32)

8 MUTE button (M)

This mutes the sound of the amp connected to this unit.

9 TOP MENU button

To back to the top of the menu.

10 Cursor buttons (▲▼◀▶)

These select items. (☞ p. 34, 44, 47, 51)

11 Search button (SRCH)

This displays the search menu. (☞ p. 35, 42, 54)

12 Number buttons (0 – 9, +10)

These enter letters or numbers into the unit. (☞ p. 45, 81)

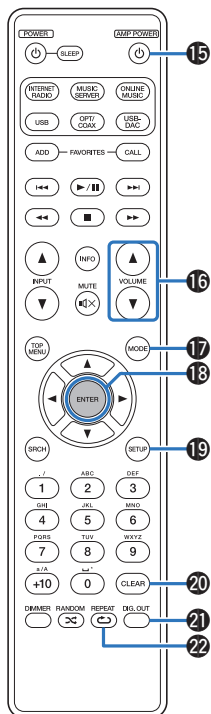
13 DIMMER button

Adjust the display brightness of this unit. (☞ p. 33)

14 RANDOM button (R)

Switches the random playback. (☞ p. 41, 49, 53)





15 AMP POWER button (⏻)

This turns the power of the amp connected to this unit on or off.

16 Amplifier volume adjustment buttons (VOLUME ▲▼)

This adjusts the volume of the amp connected to this unit.

17 MODE button

This switches the playback mode. (👉 p. 48, 50)

18 ENTER button

This determines the selection. (👉 p. 34, 44, 47, 51, 79)

19 SETUP button

The setting menu is displayed on the display. (👉 p. 79)

20 CLEAR button

This cancels the settings. (👉 p. 81)

21 Digital audio output switch button (DIG. OUT)

This switches the digital audio output on/off. (👉 p. 33)

22 REPEAT button (↺)

Switches the repeat playback. (👉 p. 41, 49, 53)



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NOTE

- Do not plug in the power cord until all connections have been completed.
- Do not bundle power cords with connection cables. Doing so can result in humming or noise.

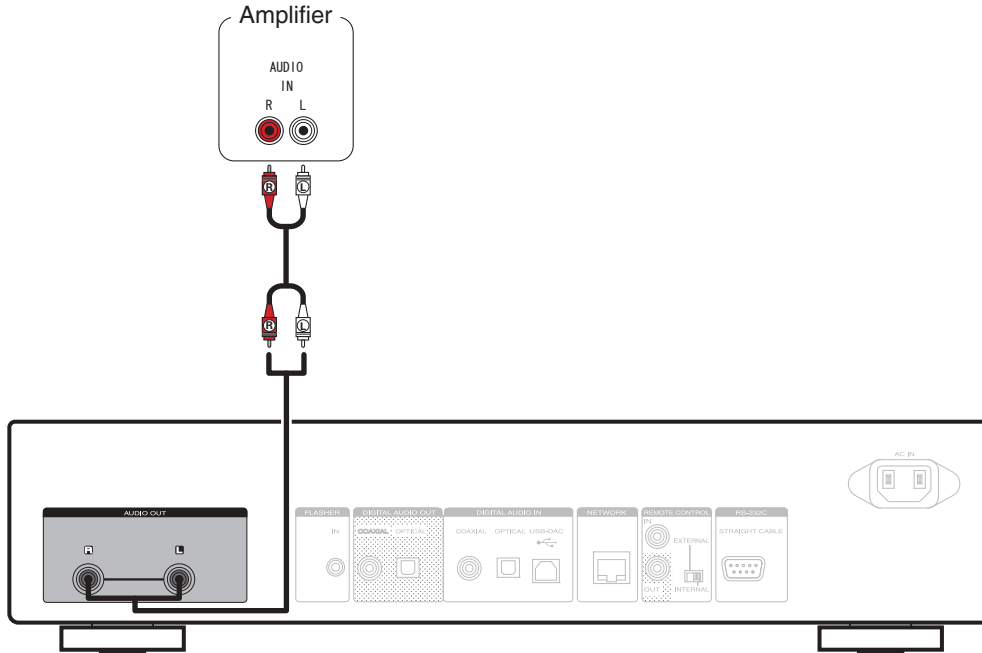

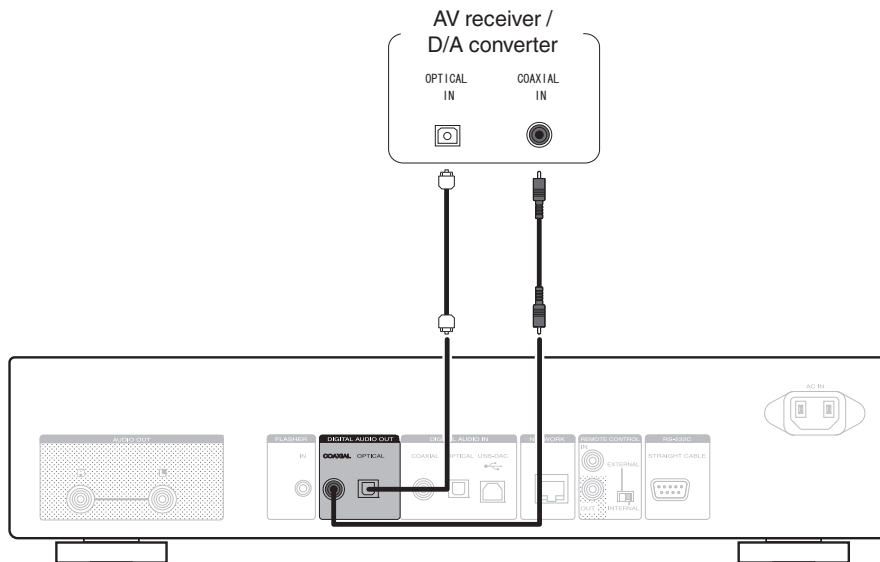


Connecting an amplifier



Connecting to a device with digital audio input connectors

Use this connection to output digital audio signals from this unit, and convert the signals for playback using the D/A converter of a connected device.



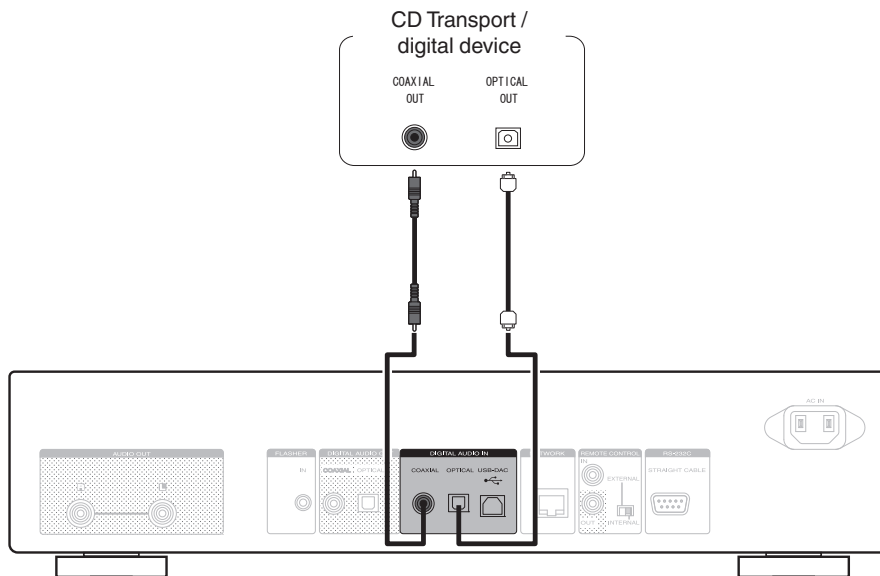
NOTE

- Digital audio output is stopped during playback of the USB-DAC (DSD signals and linear PCM signals that have a 32 kHz sampling frequency).
- Use the Digital Out button to set the digital audio output on or off. (☞ p.33)



Connecting to a device with digital audio output connectors

Use this connection to input digital audio signals to this unit, and convert the signals for playback using the D/A converter of this unit. (📖 p. 76)



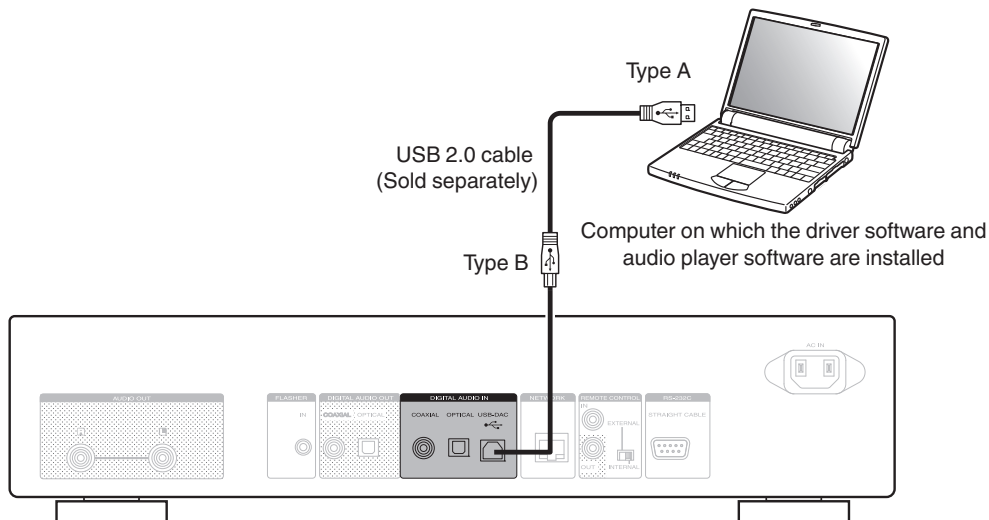
NOTE

- Linear PCM signals with a sampling frequency of 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz, 64 kHz, 88.2 kHz, 96 kHz, 176.4 kHz, or 192 kHz can be input into this device.
- Do not input non-PCM signals, such as DTS and AAC. This causes noise and could damage the speakers.



Connecting a PC or Mac

By connecting a computer to the USB-DAC port on the rear panel of this unit using a commercially available USB connecting cable, this unit can be used as a D/A converter. (🔗 p. 68)



- Install the dedicated driver software on the computer to enable communication between the computer and this unit in order to playback high-resolution sound source (DSD signal or 192 kHz/24 bit PCM signal) audio available on the internet. (🔗 p. 68)
- Download the driver software from the NA8005 page of the Marantz website.

NOTE

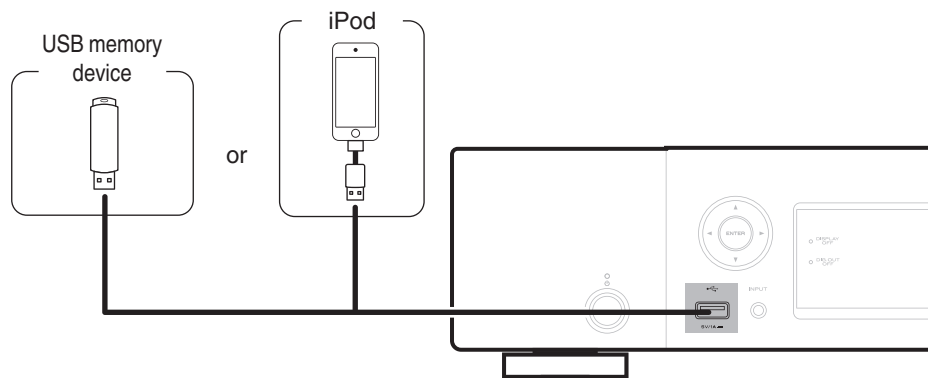
Use a cable that is 3 m or less to connect to the computer.



Connecting an iPod or USB memory device to the USB port

You can enjoy music stored on an iPod/iPhone or USB memory device.

- To connect an iPod/iPhone to this unit, use the USB adapter cable that was supplied with the iPod/iPhone.
- For operating instructions see “Playing an iPod” (🔍 p. 48) or “Playing a USB memory device” (🔍 p. 51).



Marantz does not guarantee that all USB memory devices will operate or receive power. When using a portable USB hard disk drive (HDD) which came with an AC adapter, use that device's supplied AC adapter.

NOTE

- USB memory devices will not work via a USB hub.
- Playback is not possible when connected via the front panel's USB port. Connection to a computer is possible via the digital input USB-DAC port (Type B) on the rear panel.
- Do not use an extension cable when connecting a USB memory device. This may cause radio interference with other devices.

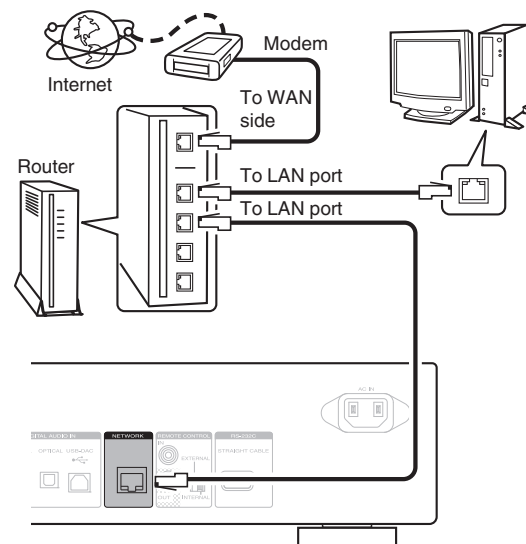

Connecting to a home network (LAN)

- This unit lets you play via your home network (LAN) music files stored on a computer and music content such as that from Internet radio. You can also operate this unit from a computer using the Web control function. “Web control function” (☞ p. 62)
- You can update by downloading the latest firmware from the Marantz website. For more information, see “Firmware” (☞ p. 83).
- Network settings are required. See “Network” (☞ p. 86).

Wired LAN



For connections to the Internet, contact an ISP (Internet Service Provider) or a computer shop.



Required system

■ Broadband Internet connection

■ Modem

Device that connects to your broadband internet provider, and is very often supplied with the service. A type that is integrated with a router is also often available.

■ Router

When using this unit, we recommend you use a router equipped with the following functions:

- Built-in DHCP server
This function automatically assigns IP addresses on the LAN.
- Built-in 100BASE-TX switch
When connecting multiple devices, we recommend a switching hub with a speed of 100 Mbps or greater.

■ LAN cable (CAT-5 or greater recommended)

- Use only a shielded STP or ScTP LAN cable which is easily available at electronics stores.
- The normal shielded-type LAN cable is recommended. If a flat-type cable or unshielded-type cable is used, other devices could be affected by noise.



- When using this unit connected to a network with no DHCP function, make the settings for the IP address, etc., at “Network connection (when “DHCP” settings is “Off”)” (☞ p. 86).
- With this unit, it is possible to use the DHCP and Auto IP functions to make the network settings automatically.
- With this unit, it is possible to use the DHCP and Auto IP functions to make the network settings automatically. When this unit is connected to a network that does not have the DHCP function, configure settings such as the IP address, etc. in “Network connection (when “DHCP” setting is “Off”)” (☞ p. 86).
- When setting manually, check the setting contents with the network administrator.

NOTE

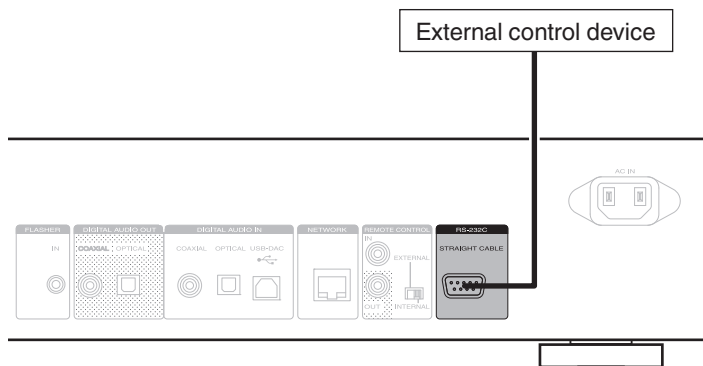
- A contract with an ISP is required to connect to the Internet.
- No additional contract is needed if you already have a broadband connection to the Internet.
- The types of routers that can be used depend on the ISP. Contact your ISP or a computer shop for details.
- Marantz assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any communication errors or troubles resulting from customer’s network environment or connected devices.
- This unit is not compatible with PPPoE. A PPPoE-compatible router is required if you have a contract for a type of line set by PPPoE.
- Do not connect an NETWORK connector directly to the LAN port / Ethernet connector on your computer.
- To listen to audio streaming, use a router that supports audio streaming.



Other connections

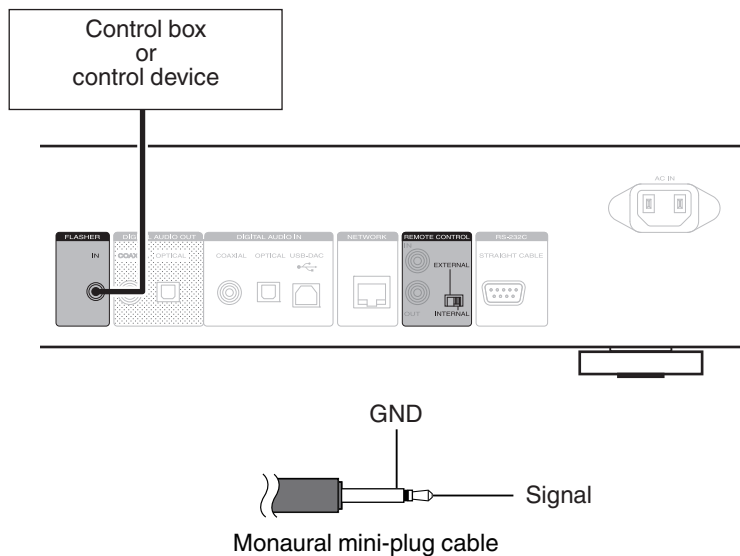
RS-232C connector

Used to connect external control devices.
(Use a straight cable for the connection.)



FLASHER IN jack

This unit can be controlled by connecting a control box or other control device to this unit.



To use the FLASHER IN jack, set the EXTERNAL/INTERNAL switch to "INTERNAL".



REMOTE CONTROL jack

If this unit is connected to a Marantz amp, the amp can be controlled via this unit using the Marantz Remote App or web control function. Also, remote control signals received by the amp can be used to control this unit. Next, configure the “Connections” and “Settings”.

Connection

Use the supplied remote connector cable to connect the REMOTE CONTROL IN connector of this unit to REMOTE CONTROL OUT connector of the amplifier.

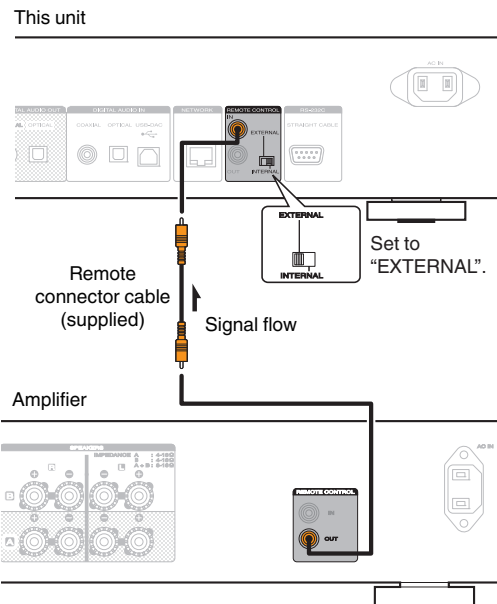
Setting

Turn the EXTERNAL/INTERNAL switch on the unit to “EXTERNAL”.

- This setting will disable remote sensor reception of this unit.
- To operate the unit, point the remote control at the remote sensor of the amplifier.

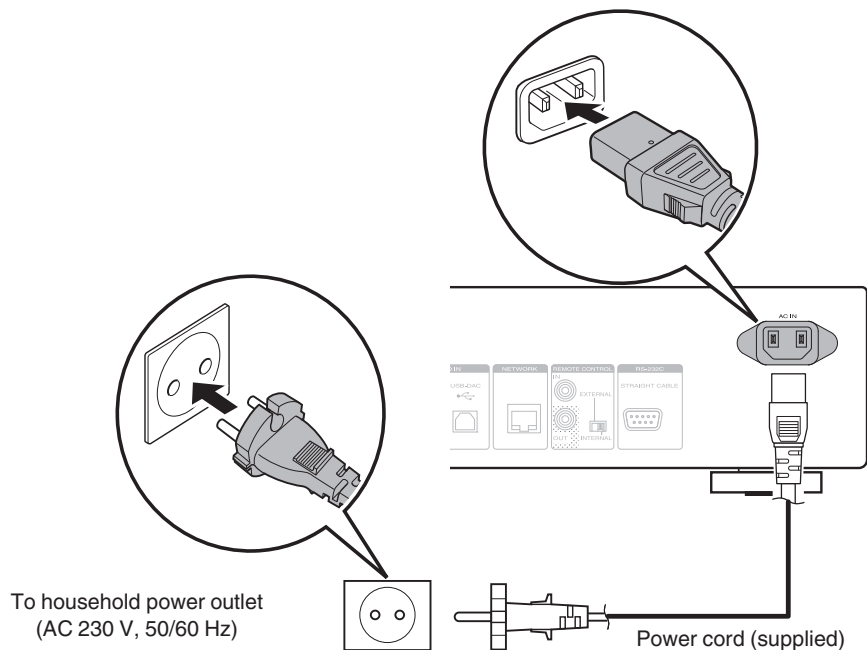


To use this unit by itself without connecting an amplifier, turn the switch to “INTERNAL”.



Connecting the power cord

Wait until all connections have been completed before connecting the power cord.

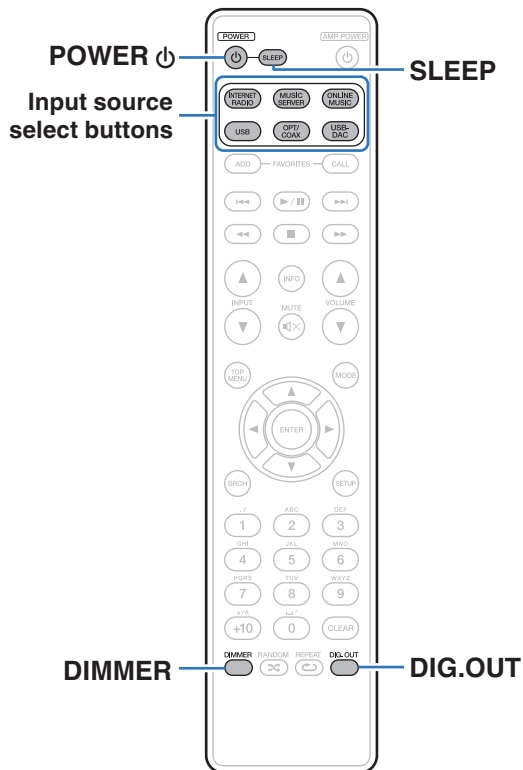


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Basic operation



Turning the power on

- 1 Press **POWER** (power icon) to turn on power to the unit.
The power indicator turns off.



- You can also switch the power to standby by pressing (power icon) on the main unit.
- When you turn on the power of this unit for the first time after purchasing it, the “Quick Setup” menu starts up. For details on “Quick Setup” operations, see the separate “Quick Start Guide”.
- If you cancelled “Quick Setup” menu or changed the network environment, perform “Setup” – “Quick Setup”.



■ Switching the power to standby

1 Press POWER .

The unit switches to standby mode.

- Power indicator
 - Normal standby : Red
 - When "Network Control" is set to "On" : Orange
 - iPod charge standby : Orange

NOTE

Power continues to be supplied to some of the circuitry even when the power is in the standby mode. When leaving home for long periods of time or when going on vacation, unplug the power cord from the power outlet.

■ Completely turning off the power

Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.

Selecting the input source

■ Selecting the input source using the remote control

- 1 Press the input source select button to be played back.
 - The desired input source can be selected directly.

■ Selecting the input source using the main unit

- 1 Press INPUT.
 - The input source is switched each time the button is pressed.



Switching the display's brightness

The display brightness can be adjusted between four levels. Switching the display off reduces a source of noise that affects sound quality, enabling higher sound quality playback.

1 Press DIMMER.



- When the display is turned off, the DISPLAY OFF indicator lights.
- If you operate the buttons when the display brightness is set to "Off", the display temporarily lights at 100% brightness level.

Stopping digital outputs

Stopping digital audio output reduces a source of noise that affects sound quality, enabling higher sound quality playback.

1 Press DIG. OUT.

The digital audio output is switched on and off each time the button is pressed.

- When digital output is turned off, the "DIG. OUT OFF" indicator lights up on the display.

Using the sleep timer

Use this function to automatically switch the power to the standby mode after a specific amount of time (minutes).

1 Press SLEEP during playback and select the setting time.

- The sleep timer can be set to up to 90 minutes, in steps of 10 minutes.
- After about 3 seconds, the setting is entered and the display returns to as it was before.

■ Canceling the sleep timer

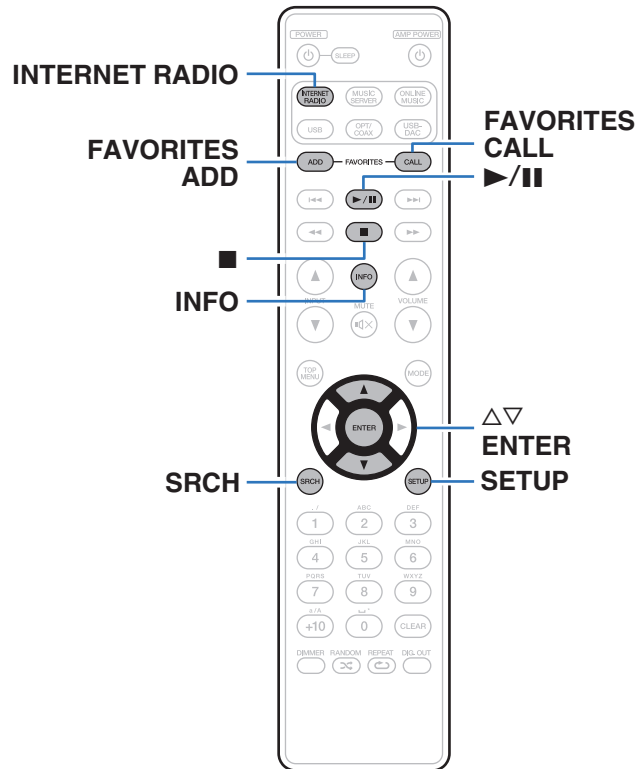
Either press SLEEP to select "Sleep ► OFF" or press POWER .

■ To check the time remaining until the sleep timer is activated

Press SLEEP.



Listening to Internet Radio



- Internet Radio refers to radio broadcasts distributed over the Internet. Internet Radio stations from around the world can be received.
- The broadcast station types and specifications supported by this unit for playback are as follows.
 - **WMA** (Windows Media Audio)
 - **MP3** (MPEG-1 Audio Layer-3)
 - **MPEG-4 AAC**



Listening to Internet Radio

This unit memorizes the last played Internet Radio station. If you press INTERNET RADIO to switch to the Internet Radio function from another input source, the last Internet Radio station you listened to is played.

1 Prepare for playback.

- Check the network environment, then turn on this unit's power. (🔗 p. 24)

2 Press INTERNET RADIO.

3 Use $\Delta\nabla$ to select the you want to play, then press ENTER.

***** (Country name) :	Displays typical Internet Radio stations your country.
Search Stations :	Displays all Internet Radio stations that this unit can tune in to.
Search Podcasts :	Displays Internet Radio stations in the podcasts that this unit can tune in to.
Recommended Stations :	Displays recommended Internet Radio stations.
radiomarantz.com :	Displays Internet Radio stations added to favorites in vTuner. For instructions on how to add to favorites in vTuner, see "Using vTuner to add Internet Radio stations to favorites" ("Using vTuner to add Internet Radio stations to favorites" (🔗 p. 37)).
Recently Played :	Displays recently played Internet Radio stations. Up to 20 stations can be stored in "Recently Played".
Search by Keyword :	Displays Internet Radio stations searched by keyword. For character input, see "Inputting characters" (🔗 p. 80).



4 Use Δ / ∇ to select the station, then press ENTER.

Playback starts once buffering reaches “100%”.

The radio station database service may be suspended or be otherwise unavailable without notice.



Using vTuner to add Internet Radio stations to favorites

There are many Internet Radio stations in the world, and this unit can tune into these stations. But finding the radio station you want to hear may be difficult, because there are too many stations. If this is the case, then please use vTuner, an Internet Radio station search website specifically designed for this unit. You can use your PC to search Internet Radio stations and add them as your favorites. This unit can play radio stations added to vTuner.

- 1 Check the MAC address of this unit.**
 - The MAC address is necessary when you create an account for vTuner.
- 2 Use your PC to access the vTuner website (<http://www.radiomarantz.com>).**
- 3 Enter the MAC address of this unit, then click “Go”.**
- 4 Enter your E-mail address and a password of your choice.**
- 5 Select the search criteria (genre, region, language, etc.) of your choice.**
 - You can also enter a keyword to search for a station you want to hear.

6 Select the radio station of your choice from the list, and then click the Add to Favorites icon.

7 Enter the name of the favorite group, then click “Go”.

A new favorite group that includes the selected radio station is created.

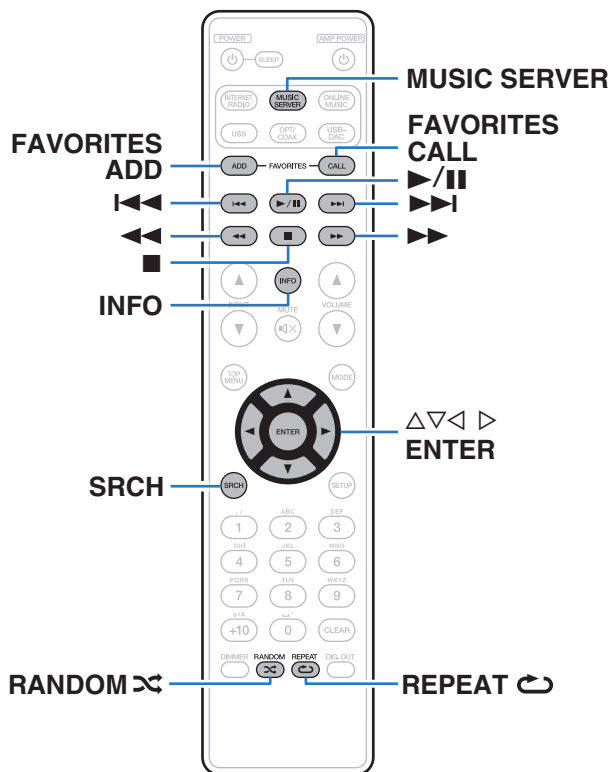

Playing back files stored on a PC and NAS



- This unit can play back music files and playlists (m3u, wpl) stored on a PC and on Network Attached Storage (NAS) that supports DLNA.
- The network audio playback function of this unit connects to the server using technologies shown below.
 - Windows Media Player Network Sharing Service
 - Windows Media DRM10
- This unit can play back the following files.
 - **WMA** (Windows Media Audio)
 - **MP3** (MPEG-1 Audio Layer-3)
 - **WAV**
 - **MPEG-4 AAC**
 - **FLAC** (Free Lossless Audio Codec)
 - **ALAC** (Apple Lossless Audio Codec)
 - **AIFF**
 - **DSD** (2-channel)



Applying media sharing settings

Here, we apply the settings to share music files stored on a PC and NAS on the network.

If you are using a Media Server, be sure to apply this setting first.

■ Windows Media Player 12 (Windows 7 / Windows 8)

NOTE

Perform this procedure after changing the control panel display to “Category”.

- 1 Start up Windows Media Player 12 on the PC.
- 2 Select “More streaming options...” in the “Stream”.
- 3 Select “Allowed” in the drop-down list for “Marantz NA8005”.
- 4 Select “Allowed” in the drop-down list for “Media programs on this PC and remote connections...”.
- 5 Follow the screen instructions to end the setting.

■ When using Windows Media Player 11

- 1 Start up Windows Media Player 11 on the PC.
- 2 Select “Media Sharing” in the “Library”.
- 3 Click the “Share my media” check box, select “Marantz NA8005”, and then click “Allow”.
- 4 As you did in step 3, select the icon of the device (other PCs and mobile devices) you want to use as a media controller, and then click “Allow”.
- 5 Click “OK” to finish.

■ Sharing media stored in NAS

Change settings on the NAS to allow this unit and other devices (PCs and mobile devices) used as media controllers to access the NAS. For details, see the owner’s manual that came with the NAS.



Playing back files stored on PC and NAS

Use this procedure to play music files or playlists.

1 Prepare for playback.

- ① Check the network environment, then turn on this unit's power. (🔗 p. 31)
- ② If settings are required, make the "Network" (🔗 p. 86).
- ③ Prepare the computer. ("Applying media sharing settings" (🔗 p. 39), "About Music server" (🔗 p. 42))

2 Press MUSIC SERVER to switch the input source to "Music Server".

3 Use $\Delta\nabla$ to select the server including the file to be played, then press ENTER.

4 Use $\Delta\nabla$ to select the search item or folder, then press ENTER.

5 Repeat step 4 until the file is displayed.

6 Use $\Delta\nabla$ to select the file, then press ENTER.

Playback starts once buffering reaches "100%".



WMA Lossless files can be played when using a server supporting transcoding, such as Windows Media Player (Ver.11 or later).

NOTE

- When playing back music files with your PC or NAS connected through wireless LAN, audio may be interrupted depending on your wireless LAN environment. In this case, play back music files with your PC or NAS connected through wired LAN.
- The order in which the tracks/files are displayed depends on the server specifications. If the tracks/files are not displayed in alphabetical order due to the server specifications, searching by the first letter may not work properly.





Performing repeat playback

1 Press REPEAT .

Repeat playback starts.

- The repeat mode is switched each time the button is pressed.


 (Single-track repeat): Only 1 track plays repeatedly.

Menu operation

1 Press **SETUP** while playback is stopped.

The menu is displayed on the display.

2 Use Δ / ∇ to select the menu to be set or operated, then press **ENTER**.

3 Use Δ / ∇ to change to desired setting.

4 Press **ENTER** to enter the setting.

- To return to the previous item, press \triangleleft .
- Exiting the Menu, press **SETUP** while the menu is displayed. The display returns to the standard display.
- To back to the top of the menu, during menu operation, press **TOP MENU**.



Inputting characters

On this unit, the names displayed for Friendly Name and search, screens can be changed as desired. You can also enter characters to search Internet radio stations and music files.

For inputting characters, there are two methods, as shown below.

Method	Operations
Using the number buttons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Operating with the remote control. Multiple characters are assigned to a button, and each time the button is pressed, a character is switched.
Using the cursor buttons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Operating with the remote control or the main unit. Use Δ ∇ \triangleleft \triangleright and ENTER to input characters.

Language

Sets the language for display the menu.

Auto-Standby

When this unit is in the stop state and there is no input signal and operation for 15 minutes, it automatically enters the standby mode.

On(Default):	The unit goes into standby after 15 minutes.
Off:	The unit does not go into standby automatically.



- The auto standby function does not operate when the input source is "iPod" (direct mode).
- When iPod is being charged, this unit enters the power standby mode after charging.



Firmware

Set whether or not to check for firmware update, update the firmware, and display update, upgrade and alert notifications.

■ Update

- In order to update the firmware, the environment and settings required for connecting to broadband internet are needed. (🔧 p. 25)
- Perform the firmware update operation after at least 2 minutes has elapsed since turning this unit's power on.

Check For Update: Check for firmware updates.

Update Start:

Execute the update process. When the update starts, the menu screen is shut down. During the update, the progress is shown on the display.



This unit automatically retries updating if updating fails.

■ Notifications

Notification messages are displayed in the screen when the power is switched on when new firmware can be used, or when there are other notification messages.

Connect to broadband Internet when using this function. (🔧 p. 24)

Update

On(Default): Display update message.

Off: Do not display update message.

Upgrade

On(Default): Display upgrade message.

Off: Do not display upgrade message.

Notification Alerts

On(Default): Displays notification messages from Marantz in the popup menu.

Off: Does not display notification messages from Marantz in the popup menu.



■ Add New Feature

In order to add new functions, the environment and settings required for connecting to broadband internet are needed. (☞ p. 25)

Perform the add new feature operation after at least 2 minutes has elapsed since turning this unit's power on.

Upgrade Status:

Display a list of the additional functions provided by the upgrade.

Upgrade Start:

Execute the upgrade process.

- If the upgrade is not successful, an error message identical to those in "Update" (☞ p. 83) will appear on the display. Check the settings and network environment and then perform the upgrade again.

Upgrade ID:

The ID number shown on this screen is needed when carrying out the procedure.



- See the Marantz website for details about upgrades.
- When the procedure is complete, "Registered" is displayed in this menu and upgrades can be carried out. If the procedure has not been carried out, "Not Registered" is displayed.

Notes concerning use of "Update" and "Add New Feature"

- In order to add new functions, the environment and settings required for connecting to broadband internet are needed. (☞ p. 24)
- Perform the add new feature operation after at least 2 minutes has elapsed since turning this unit's power on.
- Do not turn off the power until updating or upgrading is completed.
- Even with a broadband connection to the Internet, approximately 20 minutes is required for the updating/upgrading procedure to be completed.
- Once updating/upgrade starts, normal operations on this unit cannot be performed until updating/upgrading is completed.
- Furthermore, updating/upgrading the firmware may reset the backup data for the parameters, etc. set for this unit.
- When the update or upgrade failed with a message such as "Update failed" and "Download failed". Remove and re-insert the power cord. "Update Retry" appears on the display and update restarts from the point at which update failed. If the error continues despite this, check the network environment.



- Information regarding the "Update" function and "Add New Feature" will be announced on the Marantz web site each time related plans are defined.
- When usable new firmware is released with "Update" or "Add New Feature", a notification message is displayed on the menu screen. When you do not want to be notified, set "Update" (☞ p. 83) and "Upgrade" (☞ p. 83) to "Off".



Network

To use this unit by connecting it to a home network (LAN), you must configure network settings.

If you set up your home network via DHCP, set “DHCP” to “On” (use the default setting). This allows this unit to use your home network.

If you assign an IP address for each device, you must use the “IP Address” setting to assign an IP address to this unit and enter the information about your home network such as the gateway address and subnet mask.

Network Information

Displays network information.

Friendly Name / DHCP On or Off / IP Address / MAC Address

Network Control

Enables network communication in standby power mode.

On: Network is on during standby. Main unit operable with a network compatible controller.

Off (Default): Suspend network function during standby.



Set to “On” when using the web control function or a network compatible controller.

NOTE

When “Network Control” is set to “On”, it consumes more standby power.


Friendly Name

The Friendly Name is the name of this unit displayed on the network.

■ Friendly Name

When you press ENTER, you can change the Friendly Name according to your preferences.



- Up to 63 characters can be input.
- For character input, see “Inputting characters” ( p. 80).
- The default Friendly Name on first use is “NA8005”.

■ Default

Restores Friendly Name, which you had changed, to the default setting.



Settings

Configure the proxy settings and IP address.

- If you are using a broadband router (DHCP function), the information required for network connection such as the IP address will be automatically configured since the DHCP function is set to “On” in the default settings of this unit.
- Set up the IP Address, Subnet Mask, Default Gateway and DNS server information only when assigning a fixed IP address or when connecting to a network without DHCP function.
- Configure the proxy settings when using a proxy server to connect to the Internet.

■ DHCP

Selects how to connect to the network.

On (Default):	Configure the network settings automatically from your router.
Off:	Configure the network settings manually.

■ IP Address

Set the IP address within the ranges shown below.

- The Network Audio function cannot be used if other IP addresses are set.
CLASS A:10.0.0.1 - 10.255.255.254
CLASS B:172.16.0.1 - 172.31.255.254
CLASS C:192.168.0.1 - 192.168.255.254

■ Subnet Mask

When connecting an xDSL modem or connector adapter directly to this unit, input the subnet mask indicated in the documentation supplied by your provider. Normally input 255.255.255.0.

■ Gateway

When connected to a gateway (router), input its IP address.

■ Primary DNS, Secondary DNS

If there is only one DNS address indicated in the documentation supplied by your provider, input it at “Primary DNS”. If two or more DNS are provided by your provider, enter both “Primary DNS” and “Secondary DNS”.



■ Proxy

Make this setting when connecting to the Internet via a proxy server.

Make the proxy settings only when you connect to the Internet via a proxy server that is on your internal network or provided by your provider, etc.

Proxy (Off) or Proxy (On):	Set the proxy server.
Proxy (Address) or Proxy (Name):	Select when inputting by address or domain name.
Address or Name:	Inputting address or domain name. Up to 38 characters can be input.
Port:	Enter port number.



- If you cannot connect to the Internet, recheck the connections and settings. (🔗 p. 24)
- If you do not understand about Internet connection, contact your ISP (Internet Service Provider) or the store from which you purchased your computer.

■ Test Connection

Test the connection.

I want to enjoy analog output audio at higher quality

- Press DIG. OUT on the remote control unit to turn digital audio output off. (👉 p. 33)
- Press the DIMMER button to turn the display off. (👉 p. 33)

I want to display the title, etc. of the file currently playing back on the iPod on this unit's display

- Press the MODE button to set Remote iPod mode. (👉 p. 48)

I want to playback WAV files

- This unit can playback WAV files that are stored on a USB memory device. (👉 p. 51)

Simple operations in the power off state

- Press the ► or ►/|| button to automatically turn the unit's power supply on and start playback of the last selected input source.
- When the "Network Control" function is set to "On", you can perform playback, or other operations through AirPlay, App or the web control function.

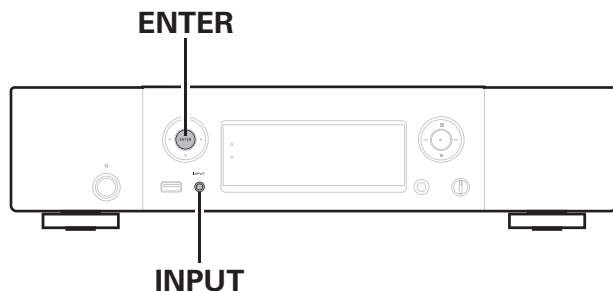

Explanation of terms

AirPlay

AirPlay sends (plays) contents recorded in iTunes or on an iPhone/iPod touch to a compatible device via the network.

ALAC (Apple Lossless Audio Codec)

This is a codec for lossless audio compression method developed by Apple Inc. This codec can be played back on iTunes, iPod or iPhone. Data compressed to approximately 60 – 70 % can be decompressed to exactly the same original data.

App Store

App Store is a site that sells application software for such devices as the iPhone or iPod Touch, and is operated by Apple Inc.

DLNA

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DSD (Direct-Stream Digital)

One of the audio data recording methods, it is the signal aspect used to store audio signals on a super audio CD, and is Δ - Σ modulated digital audio. It is configured of an array of single bit values at a 2.8224MHz sampling rate.

FLAC

FLAC stands for Free lossless Audio Codec, and is a lossless free audio file format. Lossless means that the audio is compressed without any loss in quality.

The FLAC license is as shown below.

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iTunes

iTunes is the name of the multimedia player provided by Apple Inc. iTunes is the name of the multimedia player provided by Apple Inc. It enables management and playback of multimedia contents including music and movies. iTunes supports many main file formats including AAC, WAV, and MP3.

MP3 (MPEG Audio Layer-3)

This is an internationally standardized audio data compression scheme, using the "MPEG-1" video compression standard. It compresses the data volume to about one eleventh its original size while maintaining sound quality equivalent to a music CD.

MPEG (Moving Picture Experts Group), MPEG-2, MPEG-4

These are the names for digital compression format standards used for the encoding of video and audio. Video standards include "MPEG-1 Video", "MPEG-2 Video", "MPEG-4 Visual", "MPEG-4 AVC". Audio standards include "MPEG-1 Audio", "MPEG-2 Audio", "MPEG-4 AAC".

Sampling frequency

Sampling involves taking a reading of a sound wave (analog signal) at regular intervals and expressing the height of the wave at each reading in digitized format (producing a digital signal).

The number of readings taken in one second is called the “sampling frequency”. The larger the value, the closer the reproduced sound is to the original.

Bit rate

This expresses the read amount per 1 second of video/audio data recorded in a disc. A larger number means higher sound quality, but also means a larger file size.

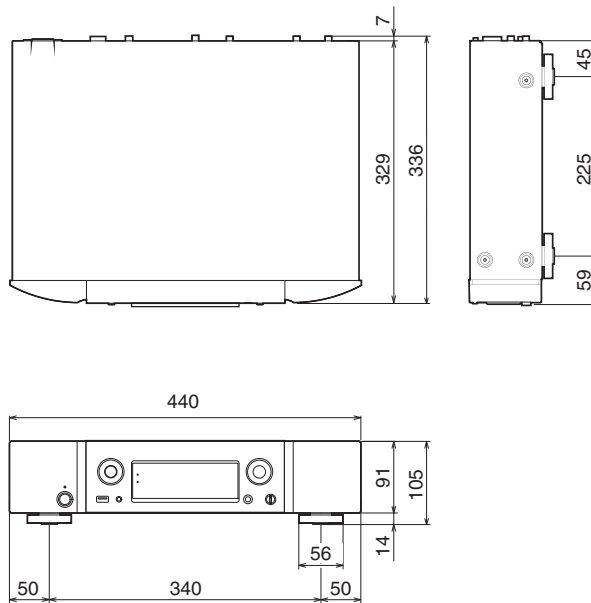
